AN ORDINANCE APPROVING A ZONING MAP AMENDMENT FOR PARCEL 37-00221 FROM MU-1 RURAL NEIGHBORHOOD CENTER TO R-5 MIXED DENSITY RESIDENTIAL, AS MORE FULLY DESCRIBED AND DEPICTED HEREIN AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

CITY OF CUYAHOGA FALLS, OHIO

WHEREAS, the Charter of the City of Cuyahoga Falls requires that all decisions made by the Planning Commission be submitted to Council; and

WHEREAS, on October 6, 2020 the Planning Commission considered an application for zoning map amendment from applicant Petros Development Group and recommended a zoning map amendment for parcel 37-00221 from MU-1 Rural Neighborhood Center to R-5 Mixed Density Residential. The zoning map amendment parcel is 12.3276 acres; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission recommended the map amendment based on conceptual plans and findings more fully described in Project File MAP-20-00027.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County of Summit, and State of Ohio:

Section 1. That the zoning classification is hereby changed from MU-1 Rural Neighborhood Center to R-5 Mixed Density Residential for parcel 37-00221. Petros Development Group is proposing the development of approximately 49 attached single family dwellings as depicted in the attachment.

Section 2. That any other ordinances or resolutions or portions of ordinances and resolutions inconsistent herewith be and the same are hereby repealed, but any ordinances and resolutions not inconsistent herewith and which have not previously been repealed are hereby ratified and confirmed

Section 3. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, to the extent applicable, including Chapter 107 of the Codified Ordinances and Substitute House Bill 197 passed by the 133rd General Assembly.

That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety, convenience and welfare of the City of Cuyahoga Falls and the inhabitants thereof, for the reason that it is immediately necessary to permit timely and appropriate development of this property, and provided it receives the affirmative vote of two thirds of the members elected or appointed to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest period allowed by law.

RESOLUTION NO. – 2020

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO APPLY FOR AND ACCEPT FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE IN THE FORM OF A GRANT OR LOAN FROM THE OHIO PUBLIC WORKS COMMISSION FOR REPLACEMENT OF 6" AND 10" WATER MAINS IN LOOMIS AVENUE, MAGNOLIA AVENUE, MURRAY STREET, AND RITCHIE STREET, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Ohio Public Works Commission (OPWC), through its State Capital Improvement Program and Local Transportation Improvement Program, provides financial assistance to political subdivisions for capital improvements to public infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, the City of Cuyahoga Falls has identified the need, plans for, and proposes a capital improvement to public infrastructure, to wit: replacement of 6" and 10" water mains with 8" and 12" water mains, including all necessary appurtenances, in Loomis Avenue, Magnolia Avenue, Murray Street and Ritchie Street; and

WHEREAS, the infrastructure improvement hereinabove described is considered to be a priority need for the community and is a qualified project under the OPWC program.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County of Summit and State of Ohio, that:

 <u>Section 1.</u> The Mayor is hereby authorized to apply for and accept financial assistance in the form of a grant or loan from the Ohio Public Works Commission (OPWC) for the purpose of supporting the capital improvement consisting of replacement of 6" and 10" water mains with a 8" and 12" water mains, including all necessary appurtenances, in Loomis Avenue, Magnolia Avenue, Murray Street and Ritchie Street, by means of the State Capital Improvement Program (SCIP) and/or Local Transportation Improvement Program (LTIP) administered by the OPWC.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into agreements as may be necessary to apply for and accept the financial assistance mentioned herein.

<u>Section 3.</u> The Clerk is hereby directed to prepare and transmit a certified copy of this Resolution to the OPWC.

<u>Section 4.</u> It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in

compliance with all legal requirements, to the extent applicable, including Chapter 107 of the Codified Ordinances and Substitute House Bill 197 passed by the 133rd General Assembly.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC SERVICE TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT OR CONTRACTS, ACCORDING TO LAW, FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF OVERHEAD AND UNDERGROUND POWER LINES ON FEEDER 503, FEEDER 504, AND FEEDER 702 TO PREPARE FOR 12.5KV CONVERSION, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, Feeder 503, Feeder 504 and Feeder 702 have equipment that has reached the end of its expected useful life and must be replaced; and

WHEREAS, Feeder 503, Feeder 504 and Feeder 702 have under-rated electrical equipment that needs to be upgraded to make the feeders ready for conversion from 4160 V to 12.5 kV; and

WHEREAS, Old Substation 5 will be retired and this work will enable this to occur; and

WHEREAS, the Feeder 702's load is also being moved to New Substation 5.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County of Summit and State of Ohio:

<u>Section 1.</u> That the Director of Public Service is hereby authorized to enter into a contract or contracts, according to law, for the construction of overhead and underground power lines on Feeder 503, Feeder 504, and Feeder 702 to replace or eliminate aged equipment and under-voltage rated electrical equipment with properly rated electrical equipment to make the lines ready to be converted to 12.5 kV.

<u>Section 2.</u> That the Director of Finance is hereby authorized and directed to make payment for same from the Electric Fund, line item Capital Outlay.

<u>Section 3.</u> That any other ordinances and resolutions or portions of ordinances and resolutions inconsistent herewith be and the same are hereby repealed, but any ordinances and resolutions or portions of ordinances and resolutions not inconsistent herewith and which have not previously been repealed are hereby ratified and confirmed.

<u>Section 4.</u> It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, to the extent applicable, including Chapter 107 of the Codified Ordinances and Substitute House Bill 197 passed by the 133rd General Assembly.
