AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING ANNUAL APPROPRIATIONS OF MONEY FOR THE CURRENT EXPENSES, CAPITAL EXPENDITURES AND OTHER EXPENSES OF THE CITY OF CUYAHOGA FALLS FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING DECEMBER 31, 2013, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

CITY OF CUYAHOGA FALLS, OHIO

WHEREAS, Ohio Revised Code §5705.38 requires local taxing authorities to pass an annual appropriations measure classified so as to set forth the amounts appropriated to each office, department and division of the taxing authority; and

WHEREAS, Article VI, Section 6 of the City Charter requires the Mayor to submit an estimated budget for the coming fiscal year showing the requested allotments of the appropriations and estimated income for each office or department for the calendar year;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County of Summit and State of Ohio, that:

<u>Section 1</u>. In order to provide for the current expenses, capital expenditures, and other expenses of the City of Cuyahoga Falls for the fiscal year ending December 31, 2013, the sums summarized in Exhibit A, which is attached hereto incorporated herein by reference, are hereby appropriated and authorized for encumbrance and/or expenditure as provided therein.

<u>Section 2</u>. The fund transfers set forth in detail in Exhibit A2, and incorporated herein by reference, are hereby authorized and approved.

<u>Section 3</u>. The budget for each office and department of the City is hereby determined and approved as set forth in Exhibit B, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, and the expenditures authorized therein, and the amount authorized, shall be made in accordance with the line items identified in Exhibit B, and any disbursements within any line item set forth in Exhibit B may be paid out of the appropriations made therefor.

<u>Section 4</u>. No transfers of sums shall be made between departments. Transfers of sums from one line item listed in Exhibit B to another line item, within the same department, at any time within the fiscal year which exceed in the aggregate seven percent (7%) of the amount originally appropriated in the line item from which the transfer is made, or \$10,000.00, whichever is less, shall be prohibited unless authorized by ordinance or resolution of Council.

<u>Section 5</u>. Any amounts encumbered in a fiscal year prior to fiscal year 2013 in any and all funds of the City, are hereby re-appropriated for the purpose of expenditure in 2013 or thereafter.

<u>Section 6</u>. All funds not individually listed in this ordinance but included in the 2013 Alternative Tax Budget Information of the City of Cuyahoga Falls and included in the Amended Official Certificate of Estimated Resources for 2013 as issued by the County of Summit Budget Commission are hereby appropriated for the purpose of encumbrance and/or expenditure.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE DIRECTOR OF FINANCE TO MAKE SALARY SUPPLEMENT PAYMENTS TO ELIGIBLE FULL-TIME EMPLOYEES OF THE CITY IN FISCAL YEAR 2013, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, as a result of the financial crisis of 2008 and resulting nationwide recession, full-time bargaining and non-bargaining employees of the City were asked to and did accept concessions including salary reductions and the cancellation of customary pay increases during the last four years, in order for the City to maintain a balanced budget; and

WHEREAS, the loyalty, sacrifice and community spirit of the City's employees has enabled the City to provide high quality services to its residents notwithstanding the recent unfavorable economic conditions; and

WHEREAS, no full-time employees of the City are currently scheduled to receive any salary increases for the foreseeable future; and

WHEREAS, the City has received unanticipated one-time estate tax revenues during Fiscal Year 2012 which, while inadequate to support permanent salary adjustments, could be used to compensate employees who bore the burden of recession-mandated budget austerity during the last four years,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County of Summit, and State of Ohio, that:

Section 1. Notwithstanding and as an exception to Ord. Nos. 132-2010, 82-1987, 79-1987, and 109-1986, the Director of Finance is hereby authorized to make a onetime salary supplement payment to each eligible full-time employee of the City, in the amount of Three Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$3,500.00), in Fiscal Year 2013, but no later than January 31, 2013. In order to be eligible for the salary supplement, an employee must have been employed full-time by the City on June 30, 2012 and December 31, 2012, and remain an employee of the City as of January 18, 2013. Employees whose salaries are determined through collective bargaining shall be eligible upon amendment of the applicable collective bargaining agreement. In addition, members of City Council and the Clerk of Council shall each be eligible to receive salary supplement payments in the amount of One Thousand Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$1,250.00), provided the other eligibility conditions have been met.

Section 2. The Director of Finance is hereby authorized and directed to make the referenced payments from the various funds as appropriated for this purpose.

Section 3. Any ordinances or resolutions or portions of ordinances and resolutions inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed, but any ordinances and resolutions not inconsistent herewith and which have not previously been repealed are hereby ratified and confirmed.

Section 4.
