Planning & Zoning:

Temp. Ord. B-40

An ordinance approving a zoning map amendment for Parcels 35-00857, 35-02577 and 35-00103, from MU-3 Sub-Urban Center to E-1 Employment District, as more fully described and depicted herein, and declaring an emergency.

Finance & Appropriations:

Temp. Ord. B-56

An ordinance authorizing the Director of Public Service to enter into a contract or contracts, according to law, for the demolition and removal of demolition debris from a dangerous building located at 2360 4th Street and certifying the cost thereof to the County Fiscal Officer for collection in the manner provided by law, and declaring an emergency.

Temp. Ord. B-57

An ordinance authorizing Declarations of Official Intent under U.S. Treasury Regulations with respect to reimbursements from Note and Bond proceeds of temporary advances made for payments prior to issuance, and related matters.

Public & Industrial Improvements:

Temp. Ord. B-58

An ordinance authorizing the Mayor to enter into a lease agreement or agreements with Arkay Properties, LLC and Metro Parks, Serving Summit County, [sic] Board of Commissioners, [sic] and declaring an emergency.

An ordinance authorizing the Director of Public Service to enter into a contract or contracts, according to law, for the Chestnut Trailhead Parking Lot & Trail Improvements Phase I, and declaring an emergency.
