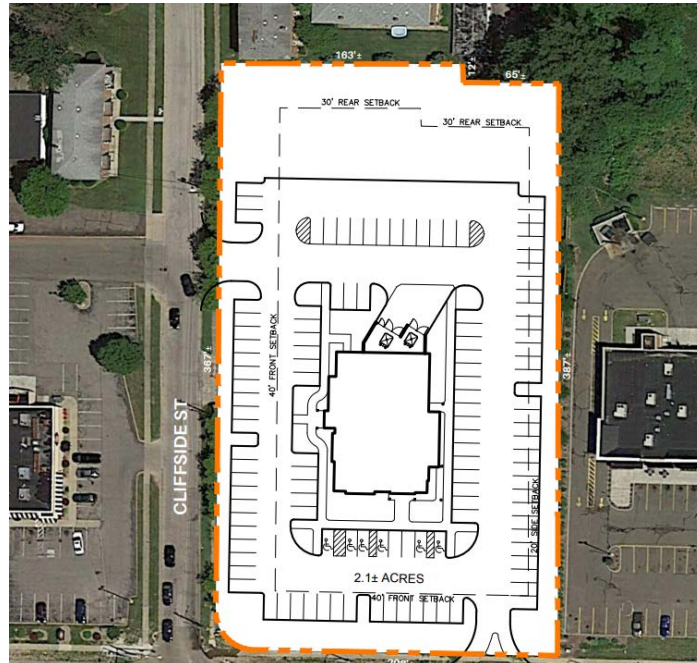

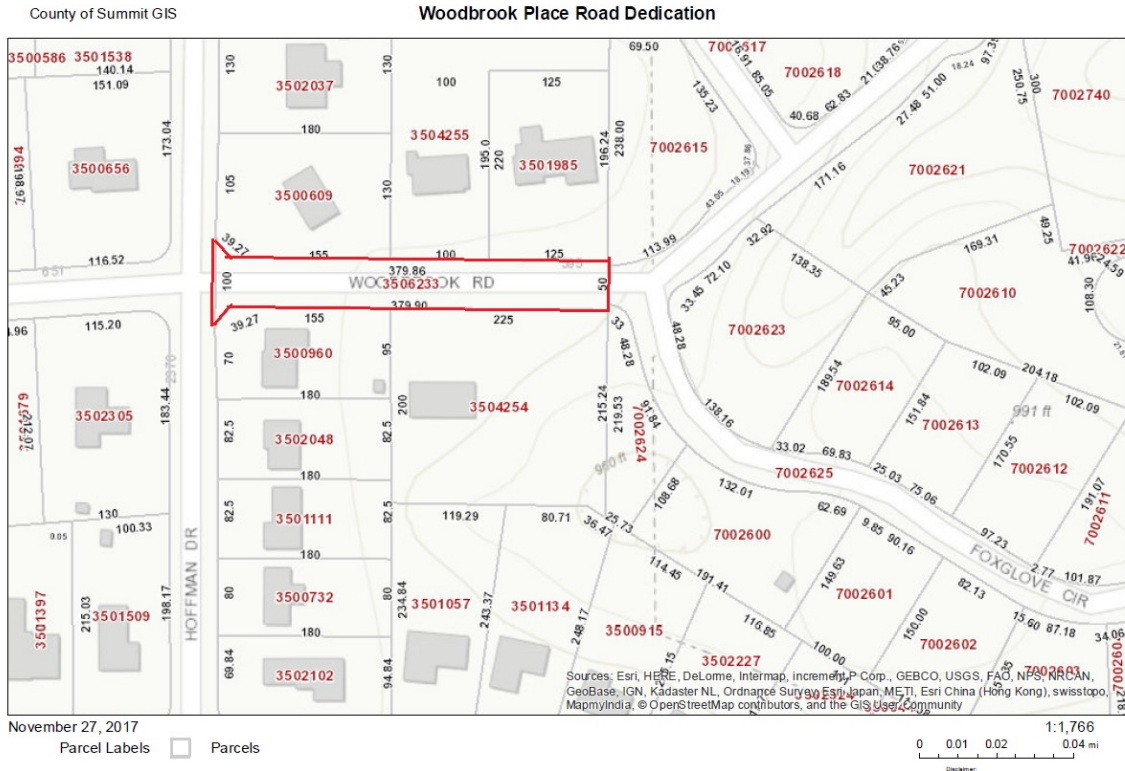

7 AN ORDINANCE LEVYING SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS FOR  
8 THE REPAIR OR REPLACEMENT OF SIDEWALKS AND  
9 DRIVE APPROACHES IN THE SIDEWALK AND DRIVE  
10 APPROACH REPAIR AND REPLACEMENT DISTRICT, FOR  
11 THE YEAR 2017, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

12  
13 WHEREAS, Resolution No. 15-2016, adopted by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga  
14 Falls on December 27, 2016, created the Sidewalk and Drive Approach Repair and  
15 Replacement District for the year 2017, and determined the necessity of adjusting or  
16 replacing certain sidewalks and drive approaches within the district; and

17  
18 WHEREAS, such sidewalks and drive approaches within the district have been  
19 repaired or replaced.

20  
21 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls,  
22 County of Summit and State of Ohio, that:

23  
24 Section 1. The portion of the total cost and expense of repairing or replacing  
25 sidewalks and drive approaches located within the Sidewalk and Drive Approach Repair  
26 and Replacement District for the year 2017 to be paid for by special assessments is  
27 hereby established at the rate of \$15.00 per linear foot for replacement of sidewalks and  
28 \$7.00 per square foot for drive approaches. That portion of the total cost of the  
29 improvement to be paid for by special assessments is hereby levied and assessed upon  
30 the lots and lands provided for in the schedule of special assessments now on file with  
31 the Clerk of Council, which special assessments are in proportion to the special benefits  
32 and are not in excess of any statutory limitation and which are hereby adopted and  
33 confirmed.

34  
35 Section 2. The assessment against each lot or parcel of land shall be payable in  
36 cash within thirty (30) days from the levy thereof in the office of the Finance Director  
37 with the further provision that all assessments thereof remaining unpaid at the  
38 expiration of said thirty days shall be certified by the Clerk of Council to the County  
39 Fiscal Officer to be placed on the tax duplicate and collected in two (2) semi-annual  
40 installments.

41  
42 Section 3. A certified copy of this ordinance shall be provided to the County Fiscal  
43 Officer by the Clerk of Council within twenty (20) days after its passage.

44  
45 Section 4. Any other ordinances or resolutions or portions of ordinances and  
46 resolutions inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed, but any ordinances and  
47 resolutions not inconsistent herewith and which have not previously been repealed are  
48 hereby ratified and confirmed.

49  
50 Section 5. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council  
51 concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open  
52 meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its  
53 Committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in  
54 compliance with all legal requirements including Chapter 107 of the Codified  
55 Ordinances.

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Section 6. This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety, convenience and welfare of the City of Cuyahoga Falls and the inhabitants thereof, and provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members elected or appointed to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest period allowed by law.

8 AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE DIRECTOR  
9 OF PUBLIC SERVICE TO ACCEPT A GRANT FROM  
10 THE STATE OF OHIO, DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC  
11 SAFETY FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF A LAW  
12 ENFORCEMENT TRAINING FACILITY, AND  
13 DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.  
14

15 WHEREAS, the City desires to design and build a state-of-the-art law enforcement training  
16 facility that will benefit the City and other Ohio law enforcement entities; and  
17

18 WHEREAS, the City has been awarded State Capital Improvement Funds through the Ohio  
19 Department of Public Safety (ODPS) in the amount of \$200,000 to assist with covering costs  
20 associated with (1) architectural engineering and design plans/drawings, (2) pre-construction  
21 site preparation, excavation, grading and any required permitting, and (3) phase I construction  
22 of the law enforcement training facility; and  
23

24 WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the City to accept the grant funds from ODPS.  
25

26 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County  
27 of Summit and State of Ohio, that:  
28

29 Section 1. The Director of Public Service is hereby authorized to accept a grant from the  
30 State of Ohio, Department of Public Safety for the construction of a law enforcement training  
31 facility, and to provide such information and to execute such documents and do all other  
32 actions as is necessary for and incidental to carrying out the requirements of this ordinance  
33 and the terms of the grant agreement.  
34

35 Section 2. The City does agree to obligate the funds required to satisfactorily complete the  
36 construction of the law enforcement training facility.  
37

38 Section 3. Any other ordinances and resolutions or portions of ordinances and resolutions  
39 inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed, but any ordinances and resolutions or portions of  
40 ordinances and resolutions not inconsistent herewith and which have not previously been  
41 repealed are hereby ratified and confirmed.

43 Section 4. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and

9 A RESOLUTION CREATING FOR THE YEAR 2018 A SIDEWALK AND  
10 DRIVE APPROACH REPAIR OR REPLACEMENT DISTRICT  
11 CONTAINING SUCH STREETS, ALLEYS, OR PUBLIC ROADWAYS  
12 WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF CUYAHOGA  
13 FALLS, DECLARING THE NECESSITY OF REPAIRING OR  
14 REPLACING THE SIDEWALKS AND DRIVE APPROACHES ABUTTING  
15 ON SUCH STREETS, ALLEYS OR PUBLIC ROADWAYS WITHIN SAID  
16 CORPORATE LIMITS AND PROVIDING THE METHOD FOR LEVYING  
17 SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.  
18

19 WHEREAS, it is the opinion of this Council that certain sidewalks and drive approaches abutting  
20 on the streets, alleys or public roadways within the City of Cuyahoga Falls are in disrepair.  
21

22 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County of  
23 Summit and State of Ohio, that:  
24

25 Section 1. A Sidewalk and Drive Approach Repair or Replacement District is hereby created for  
26 the year 2018 containing those streets, alleys or public roadways within the corporate limits of the  
27 City of Cuyahoga Falls, and declaring the necessity of repairing or replacing the sidewalks and drive  
28 approaches abutting on such streets, alleys or public roadways, and to provide the method for  
29 levying assessments and the right to object to or appeal said assessment.  
30

31 Section 2. It is hereby declared that the repair or replacement of sidewalks and drive  
32 approaches abutting on necessary streets, alleys and public roadways within the Sidewalk and Drive  
33 Approach Repair or Replacement District is necessary and will be of general benefit within the City  
34 and of special benefit to property owners abutting said sidewalks and drive approaches.  
35

36 Section 3. Property abutting the necessary streets, alleys and public roadways receiving  
37 sidewalk repair or replacement within the District may be assessed by the lineal foot of abutting  
38 sidewalk at the rate of one-half of the total cost of installing or adjusting a linear foot of sidewalk,  
39 with the remainder of such cost to be paid by the City. Property abutting the necessary streets,  
40 alleys and public roadways receiving drive approach repair or replacement within the District may be  
41 assessed by the square foot of drive approach at the rate of one-half of the total cost of installing or  
42 adjusting a square foot of drive approach, with the remainder of such cost to be paid by the City.  
43

44 Section 4. The assessment to be levied may be paid in full within thirty (30) days from the levy  
45 thereof in the office of the City Director of Finance, and all assessments thereof remaining unpaid at  
46 the expiration of said thirty (30) days shall be certified by the Clerk of Council to the County Fiscal  
47 Officer to be placed by heron the tax duplicate and collected in two (2) semi-annual installments.  
48

49 Section 5. Notice to the owners thereof shall be given by publishing the resolution establishing a  
50 sidewalk and drive approach repair or replacement district and setting forth the portion of the cost  
51 to be assessed, once each week for two weeks in a newspaper published and of general circulation to  
52 the City.  
53

54 Section 6. If an owner objects to an assessment, he shall file his objections in writing with the  
55 Clerk of Council within ten (10) days after the last publication of the resolution as provided in  
56 Section 915.03 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, thereupon, Council shall

57 consider such objections and if they are found to be well taken, may remit such portion of the  
58 assessment against the property of the objecting owner as is deemed just or may determine by  
59 resolution that a portion or portions of the work described in the ordinance adopted pursuant to  
60 Sections 915.01 or 915.02 shall not be done. Any deficiency arising from such remitter may be  
61 made up from any fund of the City available for the public improvement of streets or by  
62 contributions from the owners desiring that the work be done.  
63

64 Section 7. After the expiration of the time within which objections may be filed under Section  
65 915.04 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Cuyahoga Falls and the disposition of objections, the  
66 Director of Public Service may proceed with the work mentioned in Sections 915.01 and 915.02 of  
67 the Codified Ordinances of the City of Cuyahoga Falls or if proceeding by contract, the legislative  
68 authority shall authorize the Director of Public Service to advertise and take bids for the awarding of  
69 the necessary contracts subject to any determination by the Council that a portion or portions of  
70 such work shall not be done pursuant to Section 915.04 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of  
71 Cuyahoga Falls.  
72

73 Section 8. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and  
74 relating to the adoption of this resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that  
75 all deliberations of this Council and of any of its Committees that resulted in such formal action  
76 were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements including, to the  
77 extent applicable, Chapter 107 of the Codified Ordinances.  
78

79 Section 9. This resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the  
80 preservation of the public peace, health, safety, convenience and welfare of the City of Cuyahoga  
81 Falls and the inhabitants thereof, and provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the  
82 members elected or appointed to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its  
83 passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest  
84 period allowed by law.

13 WHEREAS, site-specific traffic control regulations of the City are established  
14 and maintained in the "Traffic Control File," a document established and  
15 maintained by the Chief of Police pursuant to Chapter 305 of the Codified

18 WHEREAS, Section 305.02 of said Chapter requires that amendments to the  
19 Traffic Control File be made only through legislation passed by City Council.

21 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of

24 Section 1. Upon the recommendation of the Traffic Committee, the Traffic  
25 Control File is hereby amended as follows:

27 1. Prohibit parking on the even sides of the following streets:

- 31 Prohibit parking on the odd side of the following streets:  
32 Preserve Circle  
33 Lakeside Oval
- 34 2. Prohibit parking on the odd side of Salt Creek Run between State  
35 Road and Preserve Circle.
- 36 3. Prohibit parking within 80' of any intersection in Salt Creek  
37 Allotment.
- 38 4. Change the no parking bus stop signs on Falls Avenue between 2<sup>nd</sup>  
39 Street and 3<sup>rd</sup> Street from no parking from 7-9 AM and 2-4 PM to no  
40 parking 2-4 PM.

42 Section 2. The Chief of Police is hereby authorized and directed to note in
