ORDINANCE NO.

-2016

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 107.07 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES, MEETINGS OPEN TO THE PUBLIC, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Ohio Open Meetings Act requires public bodies to take official action and to conduct all deliberations upon official business only in open meetings, unless a specific exception enumerated in Ohio Revised Code Section 121.22(D) applies; and

WHEREAS, based upon the plain language of the Ohio Revised Code, any meeting about public business involving the majority of City Council or any of its committees or sub-committees must be an open meeting; and

WHEREAS, the Ohio Supreme Court has long blocked attempts to circumvent the Open Meetings Act and has enforced laws strictly upon governing bodies, including the recent case White v. King 2016-Ohio-2770 (May 3, 2016); and

WHEREAS, one of the strengths of American government is the right of the public to know and understand the actions of their elected officials, including the means by which decisions are reached; and

WHEREAS, Council finds that the change to Section 107.07 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Cuyahoga Falls promotes accessibility, accountability and transparency in local government.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County of Summit, and State of Ohio, that:

Section 1. Section 107.07 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Cuyahoga Falls is hereby amended to read in full as follows (deleted text in strikethrough):

107.07 MEETINGS OPEN TO THE PUBLIC.

With the exception of political caucuses and executive sessions of Municipal bodies as defined in Section 107.01, all meetings and deliberations of any Municipal body upon any official business or leading to official action shall be conducted in meetings open to the public.

Section 2. Any ordinances or resolutions or portions of ordinances and resolutions inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed, but any ordinances and resolutions not inconsistent herewith and which have not previously been repealed are hereby ratified and confirmed.

Section 3. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all requirements including Chapter 107 of the Codified Ordinances.

Any other ordinances or resolutions or portions of ordinances and resolutions inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed, but any ordinances and resolutions not inconsistent herewith and which have not previously been repealed are hereby ratified and confirmed.

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Section 3. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the acceptance of this resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, to the extent applicable, including Chapter 107 of the Codified Ordinances.

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Section 4. This resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety, convenience and welfare of the City of Cuyahoga Falls and the inhabitants thereof, and provided it receives the affirmative vote of two thirds of the members elected or appointed to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest period allowed by law.
