NOTICE UNDER THE AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT Title II: Local Government – Services, Programs, & Activities

Modifications to Policies and Procedures: The City of Cuyahoga Falls will make all reasonable modifications to its policies and programs to ensure that people with disabilities have an equal opportunity to enjoy all of its services, programs, and activities. The ADA does not require the City of Cuyahoga Falls to take any action that would fundamentally alter the nature of its programs or services, or impose an undue financial or administrative burden.

The City of Cuyahoga Falls will not place a surcharge on a particular individual with a disability or any group of individuals with disabilities to cover the cost of providing auxiliary aids/services or reasonable modifications of policy, such as retrieving items from locations that are open to the public but are not accessible to persons who use wheelchairs.
