

9 PASSAGE OF ISSUE 36, THE CUYAHOGA FALLS CITY SCHOOL
10 DISTRICT LEVY, AT THE GENERAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON
11 NOVEMBER 3, 2020, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

13 WHEREAS, the Cuyahoga Falls City School District has nine public schools in the City of
14 Cuyahoga Falls and the Village of Silver Lake, serving 4,780 students; and

16 WHEREAS, a properly funded public school system is foundational to civic and economic
17 success; and

18
19 WHEREAS, the Cuyahoga Falls City School District has caused a proposed levy to be placed on
20 the November 3, 2020 ballot as Issue 36; and

22 WHEREAS, this levy is a renewal, not an increase, commencing in 2020 and continuing for 5
23 years.

25 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County of
26 Summit and State of Ohio, that:

28 Section 1. The Council and Administration express their support for the Cuyahoga Falls City
29 School District and urge the passage of Issue 36 at the November 3, 2020 General Election.
