17 WHEREAS, the City of Cuyahoga Falls applied for a grant through the
18 National Endowment for the Arts Our Town Program for community arts
19 engagement and art installations along the Cuyahoga River in Cuyahoga Falls
20 on August 17, 2020; and
21

22 WHEREAS, on April 8, 2021, the National Endowment for the Arts Our
23 Town Program awarded the City of Cuyahoga Falls a grant in the amount of
24 \$50,000.00, to be used for community arts engagement and art installations
25 along the Cuyahoga River in Cuyahoga Falls, Ohio.
26

27 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga
28 Falls, County of Summit, and State of Ohio, that:
29

30 Section 1. The Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into a grant agreement
31 with the National Endowment for the Arts Our Town Program for community arts
32 engagement and art installations along the Cuyahoga River in Cuyahoga Falls.
33

34 Section 2. The Mayor, Director of Finance, Director of Community
35 Development, Director of Law, and any other public officials, individually or
36 collectively as may be appropriate, are authorized to prepare and execute such
37 other documents, including contracts necessary to implement the Grant, and
38 do all other things as necessary or incidental to carrying out the intent and/or
39 requirements of the National Endowment for the Arts Our Town Program.
40

41 Section 3. Any other ordinances or resolutions or portions of ordinances and
42 resolutions inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed, but any ordinances and
43 resolutions not inconsistent herewith and which have not previously been
44 repealed are hereby ratified and confirmed.
45

46 Section 4. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council
47 concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an
48 open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of
49 any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings
50 open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, to the extent
51 applicable, including Chapter 107 of the Codified Ordinances.
52

53 Section 5. This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure
54 necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety, convenience
55 and welfare of the City of Cuyahoga Falls and the inhabitants thereof, and
56 provided it receives the affirmative vote of two thirds of the members elected or
57 appointed to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its
58 passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force
59 at the earliest period allowed by law.
