Temp. Ord. B-22

An ordinance amending the Traffic Control File by providing for installation of various traffic control devices, and declaring an emergency.

Mr. Demasi stated the Traffic Committee approved a request to designate two parking spaces in front of the store. A new tenant is moving into the building whose customers need to park, make a purchase and leave. It will help with their business. Mrs. Pyke stated this is a good thing because it is crowded. She asked if a request for a crosswalk from Prospect to Highbridge Glens would need to go through the Traffic Committee. Mr. Demasi stated that was a possibility and that he would check. Mrs. Pyke also asked that additional 25 mph signs be placed in the area. Mr. Novak stated he would do that.

Mr. Colavecchio moved to bring out Temp. Ord. B-22 with a favorable recommendation, second by Mr. Barnhart. Motion passed (3-0).

Temp. Ord. B-23

An ordinance authorizing the Director of Public Safety to enter into a contract without competitive bidding with Drive Team, Inc. for the sale of a fire truck no longer needed for any municipal purpose, and declaring an emergency.

Chief Moledar stated they had their annual inspections of the trucks and found this unit had rusted out frame rails. It was appraised at \$3,000 to \$4,000. Drive Team had a need for it because the pump was a decent pump so the City traded the unit for driver's education. The City will receive 25 spots in class for advanced driver's education for big trucks. This will complete the whole department. Mr. James commented that Chief Moledar was inventive when it comes to saving money.

Mr. Barnhart moved to bring out Temp. Ord. B-23 with a favorable recommendation, second by Mr. Colavecchio. Motion passed (3-0).
