Agenda Items

Temp. Ord. A-59

An ordinance authorizing the Mayor to enter into an agreement with the Fraternal Order of Police, Ohio Labor Council, Inc. effective January 1, 2014, and declaring an emergency.

Proponent testimony was offered by the Law Director, Russell Balthis, who stated that the ordinance authorizes the Mayor to enter into a collective bargaining agreement with the FOP, representing dispatchers, which will provide a 2.25% wage increase retroactive to January 1, 2014. The contract term ends on June 30, 2015.

There was no opponent testimony. There was no public comment.

The Chair recognized Mrs. Klinger, who asked the Finance Director whether there is money available to pay the wage increases authorized under this ordinance without increasing the City's deficit in 2014. The Finance Director stated that the City has realized savings in various budgets that will allow the City to absorb this increase in 2014.

Motion by Mr. DeRemer to release Temp. Ord. A-59 with a favorable recommendation. Seconded by Mr. Pallotta. Motion adopted by acclamation.

Temp. Ord. A-60

An ordinance authorizing the Mayor to enter into an agreement with the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees (AFSCME), Local 2662, effective January 1, 2014, and declaring an emergency.

Proponent testimony was offered by the Law Director, Russell Balthis, who stated that the terms of this contract are the same as those authorized under Temp. Ord. A-59.

There was no opponent testimony. There was no public comment.

Motion by Mr. DeRemer to release Temp. Ord. A-60 with a favorable recommendation. Seconded by Mr. Pallotta. Motion adopted by acclamation.

Non-Agenda Items


The Chair recognized a member of the public, John Drumm (no address given), who stated that the Law Department has refused to bring charges against a woman who allegedly damaged his rental property.
