New Ordinances & Resolutions

Temp. Ord. B-49

An ordinance authorizing the Mayor, as Director of Public Safety, to enter into a contract or contracts, according to law, for the purchase of turnout gear for use by the Fire Department, and declaring an emergency.

Temp. Ord. B-50

An ordinance authorizing the Director of Public Service to enter into a contract or contracts, according to law, with Brandstetter Carroll, Inc., for public engagement and preliminary design services for the Boardwalk Transformation Project, and declaring an emergency.

Temp. Ord. B-51

An ordinance authorizing the Director of Public Service to enter into a contract or contracts, according to law, for the roof replacement of the Water Treatment Center, and declaring an emergency.

Temp. Ord. B-52

An ordinance authorizing the Director of Public Service to enter into a contract or contracts, without competitive bidding, with D&S Landscaping, Inc. for emergency slope repair along West Steels Corners Road between Akron-Peninsula Road and O'Neil Road in the City of Cuyahoga Falls, and declaring an emergency.

Temp. Ord. B-53

An ordinance authorizing the Director of Public Service to enter into a contract or contracts, according to law, for the inspection, cleaning, and associated repairs for City Well #17, Well #18, and Well #22 for the Water Department, and declaring an emergency.

Temp. Ord. B-54

An ordinance authorizing the Director of Public Service to enter into a contract or contracts, with Utility Metering Solutions for professional services to complete the installation and implementation of advanced metering infrastructure systems to support the City's water and electric distribution services, and declaring an emergency.

An ordinance authorizing the Director of Public Service to enter into a contract or contracts, without competitive bidding, with Go Sustainable Energy, LLC for the review of proposals to construct solar panels on municipal buildings, and declaring an emergency.

An ordinance amending and/or supplementing Title 5, Public Utilities, Chapter 925.06, Woodridge Sanitary Sewer System Capital Cost Surcharges, to cease the collection of sanitary sewer extension surcharges in the Woodridge Sanitary Sewer District, and declaring an emergency.

An ordinance authorizing all actions necessary to accept Northeast Ohio Public Energy Council 2021 Energized Community Grant funds for energy efficiency or energy infrastructure projects, and declaring an emergency.
