42 Section 2. The Director of Public Service is authorized to enter into a contract or contracts,
43 according to law, for the demolition of the dangerous buildings listed in Section 1 above, and
44 removal of debris therefrom.

47 Projects Fund, Line Item Capital Outlay.

16 emergencies and peak shaving; and

21 generator services and repairs; and

23 WHEREAS, although no specific expenditure for maintenance and repairs
24 has individually exceeded the threshold competitive bidding amount to date,
25 collectively the expenditures may soon exceed the competitive bidding amount
26 of \$50,000.

8 A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE VETERANS TRAIL PROJECT WITHIN
9 THE CITY OF CUYAHOGA FALLS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

10
11 WHEREAS, the Veterans Trail Project is an effort led by Trail Advocates of Summit County, and joined
12 by Summit Metro Parks and Metropolitan Regional Transit Authority to construct a multi-purpose trail,
13 known as Veterans Trail, running through the cities of Akron, Cuyahoga Falls, Silver Lake, Stow, and
14 Hudson ; and

15
16 WHEREAS, the Veterans Trail was built in 1851 and used as a railway, which has been abandoned
17 since 1996; and

18
19 WHEREAS, it has long been recognized as an ideal multi-purpose trail opportunity and has been
20 studied for more than 16 years; and

21
22 WHEREAS, the Veterans Trail will provide recreational enjoyment for the residents of Cuyahoga Falls,
23 Ohio; and

24
25 WHEREAS, the Trail Advocates of Summit County have determined that a trail constructed on a
26 railway is safer because it is level, generally straight and has far less interaction with vehicular traffic.

27
28 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County of
29 Summit, State of Ohio, that:

31 Section 1. Council hereby expresses its support for the construction of a recreational multi-purpose
32 trail, known as the Veterans Trail Project, to be partially located within the City of Cuyahoga Falls, Ohio.

17 WHEREAS, the City of Cuyahoga Falls applied for a grant through the
18 National Endowment for the Arts Our Town Program for community arts
19 engagement and art installations along the Cuyahoga River in Cuyahoga Falls
20 on August 17, 2020; and

22 WHEREAS, on April 8, 2021, the National Endowment for the Arts Our
23 Town Program awarded the City of Cuyahoga Falls a grant in the amount of
24 \$50,000.00, to be used for community arts engagement and art installations
25 along the Cuyahoga River in Cuyahoga Falls, Ohio.
26

27 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga
28 Falls, County of Summit, and State of Ohio, that:
29

30 Section 1. The Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into a grant agreement
31 with the National Endowment for the Arts Our Town Program for community arts
32 engagement and art installations along the Cuyahoga River in Cuyahoga Falls.
33

34 Section 2. The Mayor, Director of Finance, Director of Community
35 Development, Director of Law, and any other public officials, individually or
36 collectively as may be appropriate, are authorized to prepare and execute such
37 other documents, including contracts necessary to implement the Grant, and
38 do all other things as necessary or incidental to carrying out the intent and/or
39 requirements of the National Endowment for the Arts Our Town Program.

41 Section 3. Any other ordinances or resolutions or portions of ordinances and
42 resolutions inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed, but any ordinances and
43 resolutions not inconsistent herewith and which have not previously been
44 repealed are hereby ratified and confirmed.
45

46 Section 4. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council
47 concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an
48 open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any
49 of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to
50 the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, to the extent applicable,
51 including Chapter 107 of the Codified Ordinances.

52 Section 5. This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure
53 necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety, convenience
54 and welfare of the City of Cuyahoga Falls and the inhabitants thereof, and
55 provided it receives the affirmative vote of two thirds of the members elected or
56 appointed to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its
57 passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force
58 at the earliest period allowed by law.
