Mr. James called the meeting to order at 6:58 p.m. Mr. Colavecchio was absent.

**Discussion:**

**Temp. Ord. A-99**

An ordinance authorizing the Director of Public Safety to enter into a contract or contracts, according to law, for installation of an Indoor Heavy Duty Modular Bullet Trap and Containment System at the Law Enforcement Training Facility, located at 3497 Wyoga Lake Road, and declaring an emergency.

Police Chief Davis stated that this ordinance is for the indoor heavy-duty bullet trap and containment system to put in the training center. The first contract was to build the actual shell of the training center. This is for the range and the ventilation system that makes sure everything is recirculating and all pure when it goes out.

Mr. James asked if they are going out for bid. Chief Davis stated that it has already been bid. Mrs. Pyke asked how many bids they received and who was awarded the bid. Chief Davis stated that there were two bids and it was awarded to Action Target. That is for the ventilation system, as well as the bullet trap. Action Target is one of the main contractors out there. They went out and visited some of their facilities. Chief Davis stated that the total project is roughly 290 days from start.

Mr. Terry Mader, 1946 Theiss Road, Cuyahoga Falls, stated that he wanted to thank this Administration for following through with the groundwork that was laid with the previous Administration. It's being a long time coming, and he appreciates that they are forward moving on this and looks forward to the completion of it for the City's safety forces.

Mr. Iula moved to bring out Temp. Ord. A-99 with a favorable recommendation, second by Mr. James. Motion passed (2-0).

**Temp. Ord. A-100**

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An ordinance authorizing the Director of Public Service to enter into a contract or contracts, according to law, for professional services necessary for engineering, bidding and management of the JV5 generator design-build project, and declaring an emergency.

Mr. Anthony Zumbo, Service Director, stated that this is a design-build project to move three former JV5 generators from Wadsworth to the City's Water Treatment Plant for emergency and peak-shaving purposes. This price includes everything to move, install and connect the generators to the power system. They're going to be set up and monitored by AMP. The generators will also have to be permitted by the EPA for emissions. The total cost of the project is \$1,034,250 and, if the City hits all five peaks for its regional transmission organization, which is PGM, and its local transmission agency, which is First Energy, then the payback will be two years. The vendor was selected through a public RFQ and is Mesa, which is the same company that is doing the JV1 generator retrofit project.

Mrs. Pyke asked if the amount of \$1,034,250 is just for the engineering cost. Mr. Zumbo stated that it is a design-build project. They're going to actually do the design, move it and construct it for that cost. Mrs. Pyke asked if it has already gone out for bid. Mr. Zumbo stated that it had.

Mr. Iula moved to bring out Temp. Ord. A-100 with a favorable recommendation, second by Mr. James. Motion passed (2-0).
