16 WHEREAS, Article I, Section 2 of the City Charter, adopted pursuant to Art.
17 XVIII, Sections 3 and 7 of the Ohio Constitution, authorizes this Council to make
18 exception to the competitive bidding procedures set forth in the Revised Code; and

20 WHEREAS, it is necessary to purchase a new outdoor rated 15KV 5-way switch
21 to replace the failed switch at Switch Vault 9; and
22

23 WHEREAS, immediately replacing the failed switch and restoring feeders 1001
24 and 1002 back to normal is essential for the reliability of the power distribution
25 system; and
26

27 WHEREAS, the Electric Department received quotes from three different
28 vendors and Brownstown Electric Supply Co., Inc. provided the lowest and best
29 quote for this equipment.

8 MONEY FOR THE CURRENT EXPENSES, CAPITAL

13 WHEREAS, Ohio Revised Code §5705.38 requires local taxing authorities to pass an annual
14 appropriations measure classified so as to set forth the amounts appropriated to each office,
15 department and division of the taxing authority; and
16

17 WHEREAS, Article VI, Section 6 of the City Charter requires the Mayor to submit an estimated
18 budget for the coming fiscal year showing the requested allotments of the appropriations and
19 estimated income for each office or department for the calendar year.
20

21 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County of
22 Summit and State of Ohio, that:
23

24 Section 1. In order to provide for the current expenses, capital expenditures, and other
25 expenses of the City of Cuyahoga Falls for the fiscal year ending December 31, 2019, the sums
26 summarized in Exhibit A, which is attached hereto incorporated herein by reference, are hereby
27 appropriated and authorized for encumbrance and/or expenditure as provided therein.
28

29 Section 2. The fund transfers set forth in detail in Exhibit A2, and incorporated herein by
30 reference, are hereby authorized and approved.
31

32 Section 3. The budget for each office and department of the City is hereby determined and
33 approved as set forth in Exhibit B, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference,
34 and the expenditures authorized therein, and the amount authorized, shall be made in accordance
35 with the line items identified in Exhibit B, and any disbursements within any line item set forth in
36 Exhibit B may be paid out of the appropriations made therefor.
37

38 Section 4. No transfers of sums shall be made between departments. Transfers of sums from
39 one line item listed in Exhibit B to another line item, within the same department, at any time within
40 the fiscal year which exceed in the aggregate seven percent (7%) of the amount originally
41 appropriated in the line item from which the transfer is made, or \$10,000.00, whichever is less, shall
42 be prohibited unless authorized by ordinance or resolution of Council.
43

44 Section 5. Any amounts encumbered in a fiscal year prior to fiscal year 2019 in any and all
45 funds of the City, are hereby re-appropriated for the purpose of expenditure in 2019 or thereafter.
46

47 Section 6. All funds not individually listed in this ordinance but included in the 2019
48 Alternative Tax Budget Information of the City of Cuyahoga Falls and included in the Amended
49 Official Certificate of Estimated Resources for 2019 as issued by the County of Summit Budget
50 Commission are hereby appropriated for the purpose of encumbrance and/or expenditure.
51

52 Section 7. Any other ordinances or resolutions or portions of ordinances and resolutions
53 inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed, but any ordinances and resolutions not inconsistent
54 herewith and which have not previously been repealed are hereby ratified and confirmed.

9 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE TRAFFIC
10 CONTROL FILE BY PROVIDING FOR INSTALLATION
11 OF VARIOUS TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICES, AND

14 WHEREAS, site-specific traffic control regulations of the City are established
15 and maintained in the "Traffic Control File," a document established and
16 maintained by the Chief of Police pursuant to Chapter 305 of the Codified
17 Ordinances, and
18

19 WHEREAS, Section 305.02 of said Chapter requires that amendments to the
20 Traffic Control File be made only through legislation passed by City Council.
21

22 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of
23 Cuyahoga Falls, County of Summit, and State of Ohio, that:
24

25 Section 1. Upon the recommendation of the Traffic Committee, the Traffic
26 Control File is hereby amended as follows:
27

- 28 1. Remove the one (1) hour parking restriction on Whitelaw between
29 Fourth Street and Nathan on the uneven address side.
- 30 2. Prohibit parking on the odd side of Whitelaw Street from 5' west of the
31 driveway located at 2440 - 4th Street to 70.5' west of the same
32 driveway.
33

34 Section 2. The Chief of Police is hereby authorized and directed to note in
35 the Traffic Control File the proper legends.
36

37 Section 3. The Mayor is hereby authorized and directed to cause the
38 installation or removal of the proper signage reflecting the above amendments.
39

40 Section 4. Any other ordinances and resolutions or portions of ordinances
41 and resolutions inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed but any ordinances
42 and resolutions or portions of ordinances and resolutions not inconsistent
43 herewith and which have not been previously repealed are hereby ratified and
44 confirmed.
45

46 Section 5. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council
47 concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an
48 open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of
49 any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open

50 to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Chapter 107
51 of the Codified Ordinances.

52
53 Section 6. This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure
54 necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety, convenience
55 and welfare of the City of Cuyahoga Falls and the inhabitants thereof and
56 provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members elected or
57 appointed to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its
58 passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force
59 at the earliest period allowed by law.

11 A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE “TIE ONE ON FOR
12 SAFETY” PROGRAM SPONSORED BY MOTHERS
13 AGAINST DRUNK DRIVING, AND DECLARING AN
14 EMERGENCY.

15
16 WHEREAS, now more than ever social gatherings which often include alcohol
17 are a common form of group entertainment; and

18
19 WHEREAS, impaired drivers on our nation’s roads kill more than 10,000 people
20 each year and cost our society more than \$37 billion annually; and

21
22 WHEREAS, the State of Ohio had 409 OVI-related motor vehicle fatalities in
23 2017, and

24
25 WHEREAS, an increase in impaired driving enforcement and a reduction in
26 impaired driving will save lives on our roadways; and

27
28 WHEREAS, to reduce these potentially dangerous and fatal situations, Mothers
29 Against Drunk Driving (MADD) started the “Tie One on for Safety” public awareness
30 program in 1986; and

31
32 WHEREAS, MADD’s program encourages the public to display a MADD red
33 ribbon in a visible location to remind others to always designate a non-drinking
34 driver; and

35
36 WHEREAS, these measures will promote a safe and family friendly environment
37 within the City.

38
39 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga
40 Falls, County of Summit and State of Ohio, that:

41
42 Section 1. The Council supports the “Tie One on for Safety” program to
43 encourage responsible behavior when consuming alcoholic beverages within the
44 City of Cuyahoga Falls.

45
46 Section 2. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council
47 concerning and relating to the adoption of this resolution were adopted in an open
48 meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its
49 committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public,
50 in compliance with all legal requirements including Chapter 107 of the Codified
51 Ordinances.
52

53 Section 3. This resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure
54 necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety, convenience and
55 welfare of the City of Cuyahoga Falls and the inhabitants thereof and provided it
56 receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members elected or appointed to
57 Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and
58 approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest
59 period allowed by law.
