AN ORDINANCE ACCEPTING THE PLANNING COMMISSION'S RECOMMENDATION FOR THE APPROVAL OF A CONDITIONAL ZONING CERTIFICATE AND MAJOR SITE PLAN FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF A 5,550 SQ. FT. CAR WASH FACILITY FOR SGT. CLEAN CAR WASH, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Charter of the City of Cuyahoga Falls requires that all decisions made by the Planning Commission be submitted to Council, and

WHEREAS, on November 2, 2021, the Planning Commission recommended approval of the conditional zoning certificate and major site plan for the construction of a 5,550 sq. ft. car wash facility for Sgt. Clean Car Wash at 2726 Hudson Drive and including the demolition of an auto repair garage, accessory structure and billboard on the property.

WHEREAS, such approval is given subject to all Planning Commission findings and provisions contained in Project File CZ-21-00040, and

WHEREAS, such approval is necessary to determine that the conditional use and site plan are satisfactory, serves the public interest, and is acceptable for recording.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County of Summit, and State of Ohio:


Section 1. That the City Council approves the conditional zoning certificate and major site plan for the construction of a 5,550 sq. ft. car wash facility for Sgt. Clean Car Wash at 2726 Hudson Drive and including the demolition of an auto repair garage, accessory structure and billboard on the property. The subject property is located in an MU-5 District. The approved site plan is depicted in the ordinance attachment and as fully described in Project File CZ-21-00040.





AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC SERVICE TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT OR CONTRACTS, ACCORDING TO LAW, FOR THE PURCHASE AND INSTALLATION OF CO2 FIRE SUPPRESSION SYSTEMS FOR GENERATORS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the city owns six generators, located at 2554 Bailey Road, which are collectively known as CF1; and

WHEREAS, five of the six generators have old fire suppression systems that are more costly to maintain; and

WHEREAS, the purchase of a CO2 fire suppression system will alleviate these issues.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County of Summit and State of Ohio, that:

Section 1. The Director of Public Service is hereby authorized to enter into a contract or contracts, according to law, for the purchase and installation of CO2 fire suppression systems for electric generators.

Section 2. The Director of Finance is hereby authorized and directed to make payment for same from the Electric Fund, line item Capital Outlay.

Section 3. Any other ordinances and resolutions or portions of ordinances and resolutions inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed, but any ordinances and resolutions or portions of ordinances and resolutions not inconsistent herewith and which have not previously been repealed are hereby ratified and confirmed.

Section 4. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Chapter 107 of the Codified Ordinances.

ORDINANCE NO. - 2021

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE PARKS AND RECREATION BOARD TO APPLY FOR AND ACCEPT A GRANT FROM THE OHIO DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES DIVISION OF PARKS AND WATERCRAFT, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the State of Ohio, through the Ohio Department of Natural Resources Division of Parks and Watercraft administers a financial assistance program to establish, develop, expand, maintain and promote boating safety programs through the Waterways Safety Fund; and

WHEREAS, the City of Cuyahoga Falls desires financial assistance to establish, develop, expand, maintain and promote boating safety programs.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County of Summit and State of Ohio, that:

<u>Section 1</u>. The Parks and Recreation Board is hereby authorized to execute and file an application with the Ohio Department of Natural Resources Division of Parks and Watercraft and to provide all information and documentation required in said application to obtain a grant for the purpose of establishing, developing, expanding, maintaining and promoting boating safety programs.

<u>Section 2</u>. The City does agree to accept the allocation funds to establish, develop, expand, maintain and promote boating safety programs and obligate the funds required to satisfactorily complete the project on a cost share basis with the City matching at least 25% of the total program cost.

<u>Section 3</u>. Any other ordinances and resolutions or portions of ordinances and resolutions inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed, but any ordinances and resolutions or portions of ordinances and resolutions not inconsistent herewith and which have not previously been repealed are hereby ratified and confirmed.

Section 4. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Chapter 107 of the Codified Ordinances.
