16 WHEREAS, Brookledge Golf Club seeks to replenish its golf cart fleet with eco-  
17 friendly, zero-emission golf carts with GPS technology; and

19 WHEREAS, the new golf cart fleet will reduce electricity use, providing a cost  
20 savings to the City; and

22 WHEREAS, the addition of GPS technology will allow geo-fencing, restricting  
23 carts to authorized areas and reduce daily cart fatigue; and

25 WHEREAS, GPS technology will also allow access to real-time location and  
26 history information in the event of an emergency on the course; and

28 WHEREAS, the City and PNC Equipment Finance, LLC and Lake Erie Golf Cars,

14 WHEREAS, the City of Cuyahoga Falls published a joint Request for Quotes for the Cuyahoga  
15 Falls Downtown Amphitheater Seating Project; and

17 WHEREAS, the seating modules in the Downtown Amphitheater, located at 2085 Front  
18 Street, are over 18 years old and are reaching the end of their effective life cycle; and

19  
20 WHEREAS, the City receives Community Development Block Grant (“CDBG”) funds from the  
21 Department of Housing and Urban Development; and

22  
23 WHEREAS, CDBG funds can be used to assist with ADA compliant renovations and  
24 modifications of public facilities and a portion of the new seating will be ADA compliant; and

26 WHEREAS, the City of Cuyahoga Falls wishes to enter into an agreement with Dant Clayton,  
27 in an amount not to exceed \$58,900.00.
