WHEREAS, the City of Cuyahoga Falls published a joint Request for Quotes for the Cuyahoga Falls Downtown Amphitheater Seating Project; and

WHEREAS, the seating modules in the Downtown Amphitheater, located at 2085 Front Street, are over 18 years old and are reaching the end of their effective life cycle; and

WHEREAS, the City receives Community Development Block Grant ("CDBG") funds from the Department of Housing and Urban Development; and

WHEREAS, CDBG funds can be used to assist with ADA compliant renovations and modifications of public facilities and a portion of the new seating will be ADA compliant; and

WHEREAS, the City of Cuyahoga Falls wishes to enter into an agreement with Dant Clayton, in an amount not to exceed \$58,900.00.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County of Summit, State of Ohio, that:

WHEREAS, the Mayor and his administration desire to appoint a designee who will act on behalf of the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County of Summit and State of Ohio, that:

Section 1. The Director of Finance, as an incident of his or her official capacity be, and is hereby designated for the period of his or her service, the representative of the City of Cuyahoga Falls on the Board of Trustees of the Summit Area Regional Council of Governments (COG) to act on behalf of the City in the discharge of its duties as a Trustee.

Section 2. The Director of Finance is authorized and empowered, acting for, in the name of and on behalf of the City, and as the City's agent, to exercise all the functions, powers, rights and privileges, and to fulfill the obligations and without limitation to attend and take part in meetings of the Board and of Committees of the Board, and to vote on and otherwise act with respect to all matters that may properly come before the Board or any Committee of the Board, and to do or cause to be done all acts, and to take all steps as may in each case be, in the opinion of such representative, necessary or desirable in order to represent the City and exercise its functions, powers, rights and privileges, and fulfill its obligations, as a Trustee of the COG and to carry out the full intent and purpose of this Resolution and the purposes and powers of the COG.

Section 3. The representative shall receive no compensation from the COG for services as a Trustee but shall be entitled to have the COG and its related entities provide meals, lodging or transportation related to service as Trustee or, alternatively, to receive reimbursement from the COG for reasonable out-of-pocket expenses associated with their services as representative for the City as Trustee, all in accordance with the COG's policies and procedures.

Section 4. Any other ordinances and resolutions or portions of ordinances and resolutions inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed but any ordinances and resolutions or portions of ordinances and resolutions not inconsistent herewith and which have not been previously repealed are hereby ratified and confirmed.

<u>Section 5.</u> It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, to the extent applicable, including Chapter 107 of the Codified Ordinances.
