AN ORDINANCE APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE A COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT AGREEMENT WITH SITE TECHNOLOGY, INC. FOR THE INSTALLATION OF PICKLEBALL COURTS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Department of Parks and Recreation desires to install two (2) regulation sized pickleball courts at Quirk Cultural Center, located at 1201 Grant Avenue, which targets programming to the city's senior citizen population and two (2) regulation sized pickleball courts at Harrington Field, located at 2610 Oakwood Drive, which is located in a low-to-moderate income area of the City; and

WHEREAS, the City of Cuyahoga Falls issued a Request for Proposals to construct the aforesaid pickleball courts; and

WHEREAS, the CDBG Loan and Grant Review Committee approved the Mayor to enter into a contract with Site Technology, Inc., in an amount not to exceed \$178,988.00 for the installation of said pickleball courts; and

WHEREAS, the City of Cuyahoga Falls wishes to enter into a CDBG Agreement with Site Technology, Inc., in an amount not to exceed \$178,988.00 for the installation of said pickleball courts.
