7 AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING AN EVIDENCE DEPOSIT
8 FUND, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

10 WHEREAS, it is necessary to establish an agency fund to record the deposit of monetary
11 police seizures, in a non-interest bearing account, until the presiding court issues a release of the
12 seizure.

14 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County of Summit and
15 State of Ohio, that:

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17 Section 1. There is hereby created an Evidence Deposit Fund.
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19 Section 2. Funds in the Evidence Deposit Fund are the deposit of monetary police seizures,
20 in a non-interest bearing account, and shall remain in the Evidence Deposit Fund until the
21 presiding court issues a release of the seizure.
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23 Section 3 The Mayor, as the appointing authority, is authorized to execute all necessary
24 documentation for receipt of such funds.
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26 Section 4. Any other ordinances and resolutions or portions of ordinances and resolutions
27 inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed, but any ordinances and resolutions or portions of
28 ordinances and resolutions not inconsistent herewith and which have not previously been
29 repealed are hereby ratified and confirmed.
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31 Section 5. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and
32 relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and
33 that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal
34 action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including
35 Chapter 107 of the Codified Ordinances.

37 Section 6. This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the
38 preservation of the public peace, health, safety, convenience and welfare of the City of Cuyahoga
39 Falls and the inhabitants thereof and provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the
40 members elected or appointed to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its
41 passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest
42 period allowed by law.
