# ordinance no. 37

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH THE FRATERNAL ORDER POLICE/OHIO LABOR COUNCIL (FOP/OLC) REPRESENTING THE DISPATCHERS, EFFECTIVE FROM JULY 1, 2005 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2008, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, Ohio Revised Code Chapter 4117 gives public employees the right to bargain collectively with their public employers regarding wages, hours, terms and other conditions of employment and enter into collective bargaining agreements; and

WHEREAS, Ohio Revised Code Chapter 4117 provides that public employers "shall" bargain collectively with an exclusive representative of employees; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and his representative and the FOP/OLC (Dispatchers) have bargained collectively, and said bargaining has resulted in a tentative agreement on a collective bargaining agreement from July 1, 2005 to June 30, 2008; and

WHEREAS, the membership of the Union has voted to ratify said collective bargaining agreement; and

WHEREAS, R.C. Chapter 4117 specifies that the public employer is required to submit to the appropriate legislative body a request for funds necessary to implement a collective bargaining agreement and for approval of any other matter requiring the approval of the appropriate legislative body;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County of Summit and State of Ohio:

<u>Section 1</u>. That the Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into an agreement between the FOP/OLC (representing the Dispatchers) and the City of Cuyahoga Falls, Ohio, effective from July 1, 2005 through June 30, 2008.

Section 2. That the contract be entered into and the terms of said contract shall be substantially in accordance with the contract on file with the Clerk of Council.

Section 3. That any other ordinances and resolutions or portions of ordinances and resolutions inconsistent herewith be and the same are hereby repealed but any ordinances and resolutions or portions of ordinances and resolutions not inconsistent herewith and which have not previously been repealed are hereby ratified and confirmed.

Section 4. That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Chapter 107 of the Codified Ordinances.
