9 AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE PARKS AND
10 RECREATION BOARD TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT OR
11 CONTRACTS, ACCORDING TO LAW, FOR THE REPAIR OF
12 THE AQUATIC CENTER ROOF, AMENDING
13 APPROPRIATIONS IN THE LEISURE TIME FUND AND
14 DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

17 WHEREAS, the original bid proposal for the natatorium roof included an
18 alternative bid for a section of pitched roof that covers the aquatic center; and
19

20 WHEREAS, it was initially believed that only a small section of the aquatic center
21 roof needed repairs and, therefore, the alternative bid was not accepted at that time;
22 and
23

24 WHEREAS, when the contractor, Campopiano Roofing Inc., got further into the roof
25 repairs, it was determined that more extensive repairs were necessary than initially
26 expected; and
27

28 WHEREAS, Campopiano Roofing Inc. was the lowest bidder for the roofing repairs
29 and is willing to honor its original alternate bid; and

31 WHEREAS, these additional repairs to the aquatic center roof are in the public
32 interest and serve the public good by protecting this valuable asset.
33

34 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga
35 Falls, County of Summit and State of Ohio, that:
36

37 Section 1. The Parks and Recreation Board is hereby authorized to enter into a
38 contract or contracts, according to law, with Campopiano Roofing Inc. for the repair of
39 the aquatic center roof.

41 Section 2. The Finance Director is hereby authorized to increase appropriations in
42 the Leisure Time Fund, line item Capital Outlay by \$115,000, decrease appropriations
43 in the Leisure time Fund, line item Personal Services by \$70,000, decrease
44 appropriations in the Leisure Time Fund, line item Other Operations by \$45,000, and
45 and directed to make payment for same from the Leisure Time Fund, line item Capital
46 Outlay.

48 Section 3. Any other ordinances and resolutions or portions of ordinances and
49 resolutions inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed, but any ordinances and

50 resolutions or portions of ordinances and resolutions not inconsistent herewith and
51 which have not previously been repealed are hereby ratified and confirmed.

52
53 Section 4. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council
54 concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open
55 meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its
56 committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in
57 compliance with all legal requirements including Chapter 107 of the Codified
58 Ordinances.

60 Section 5. This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure
61 necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety, convenience and
62 welfare of the City of Cuyahoga Falls and the inhabitants thereof, and provided it
63 receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members elected or appointed to
64 Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval
65 by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest period
66 allowed by law.
