WHEREAS, the real property known as the former Mud Run Gun Club located at 333 Meadow Run Blvd. as shown in Exhibit A, is owned by the Community Improvement Corporation of Cuyahoga Falls; and

WHEREAS, the grant requires a minimum match of twenty-five (25) percent; and

WHEREAS, the Ohio Department of Development 2022 Brownfield Remediation Program requires the applicant to provide authorization from the property owner in order to submit the application as shown in Exhibit B; and

WHEREAS, the City of Cuyahoga Falls hereby supports the environmental remediation and cleanup of the former gun club property; and

WHEREAS, previous environmental studies have been prepared for this property including a Phase I Environmental Assessment (ESA), Phase II ESA and a remedial action plan; and

WHEREAS, the environmental cleanup and reutilization of this property for recreational purposes will be a benefit to the adjacent property, the Mud Brook Watershed, and the City of Cuyahoga Falls.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County of Summit, State of Ohio, that:

Section 1. This Council hereby supports and authorizes the Mayor to submit a grant application to the Ohio Department of Development under the 2022 Brownfield Remediation Program for the cleanup/remediation of the former Mud Run Gun Club property located at 333 Pleasant Meadow Boulevard.

Section 2. This Council hereby respectfully requests that the Ohio Department of Development give favorable consideration to City of Cuyahoga Falls application for funding.

Section 3. This Council hereby commits to providing a minimum match of twentyfive (25%) of the total project costs if awarded the grant.

Section 4. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements including Chapter 107 of the Codified Ordinances.

Section 5. This resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, convenience, and welfare of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, and the inhabitants thereof, and for further reason that this measure is necessary due to the upcoming grant application deadline, and this resolution shall become immediately effective upon receiving the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council and approval of the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest period allowed by law.



It is my pleasure to write this letter of support for the City of Cuyahoga Falls' submission of a Brownfield Remediation Program grant application for 333 Pleasant Meadow Boulevard, Cuyahoga Falls, Ohio 44223. The aforementioned real property is currently owned by the Community Improvement Corporation of Cuyahoga Falls and cannot be redeveloped without proper remediation. As the grant application states, an Environmental Site Assessment Phase I and II have already been completed on the property and the Analysis of Brownfields Cleanup Alternatives states that the 5.58-acre parcel of land must be remediated prior to it being redeveloped into a usable space. In fact, as a result of the extent of its contamination, the Summit County Fiscal Office lowered the appraised value of the parcel from \$150,150.00 to \$55,000.00 effective in tax year 2021.

If the City is successful in the grant application, the two entities will work in conjunction with one another to redevelop the 5.58-acre parcel into a park with trailhead amenities. This will produce the necessary connectivity to join with other trailheads in the local area. In order to make this project a reality it is imperative that we receive additional funding through the Ohio Department of Development.
