

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56 <u>Section 4.</u> That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council 57 concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open 58 meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its 59 committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in 60 compliance with all legal requirements, to the extent applicable, including Chapter 107 61 of the Codified Ordinances.

63 <u>Section 5.</u> That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure 64 necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety, convenience and 65 welfare of the City of Cuyahoga Falls and the inhabitants thereof, and provided it 66 receives the affirmative vote of two thirds of the members elected or appointed to 67 Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval 68 by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest period allowed 69 by law.
