16 Director of Public Service entered into Contract No. 8807, with Environmental Design  
17 Group to provide professional surveying and engineering services for the Boardwalk  
18 project (the "Project"); and

20 WHEREAS, pursuant to the authority of Section 181.06 of the Codified Ordinances,  
21 the City entered into a first modification of said contract on February 16, 2024; and

23 WHEREAS, additional surveying and engineering services are required for the project  
24 to proceed.

8 CODIFIED ORDINANCES, RELATING TO PAID HOLIDAYS,  
9 AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

10  
11  
12 BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County of Summit,  
13 and State of Ohio, that:

14  
15 Section 1. Section 151.06 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Cuyahoga Falls is  
16 hereby amended to read in full as follows (new text underlined; deleted text in  
17 ~~striketrough~~):

18  
19 **151.06 Paid Holidays**

20  
21 (a) All full-time, non-bargaining unit employees of the City, except elected officials,  
22 are hereby granted the following paid legal holidays:

- 23
- 24 New Year's Day
- 25 Martin Luther King Day
- 26 Presidents' Day
- 27 Good Friday
- 28 Memorial Day
- 29 Juneteenth
- 30 Independence Day
- 31 Labor Day
- 32 Veterans Day
- 33 Thanksgiving Day
- 34 Friday after Thanksgiving Day
- 35 Day before or after Christmas (as designated by the Mayor)
- 36 Christmas Day
- 37 3 Personal Leave Days
- 38

39 In the event that any of the aforementioned holidays fall on Saturday or Sunday,  
40 the Mayor, at his discretion, may proclaim the adjacent Friday or Monday as the holiday,  
41 provided that New Year's Day shall not be celebrated on any day prior to January 1 of a  
42 given year.

43  
44 (b) If an employee does not work a holiday, he shall be compensated as follows:

45 (1) Exempt Employees: An exempt employee shall receive his regular salary with  
46 no loss in pay.

47 (2) Non-Exempt Employees: A non-exempt employee shall be paid his regular  
48 wages for the holiday as holiday pay in addition to regular pay for all hours actually  
49 worked in the pay period.

50 (3) All Employees: An employee who does not work on a holiday shall receive no  
51 other compensation for the holiday as vacation pay, sick leave pay, injury pay, or paid  
52 compensatory time off. An employee who does not work a holiday due to absence without  
53 leave or other unpaid absence shall not be compensated for the holiday.

54  
55 (c) If an employee works the holiday, he shall be compensated as follows:

56 (1) Exempt employees. An exempt employee who works a holiday shall be given  
57 a corresponding amount of time off within the same pay period as the holiday without  
58 any loss in pay.

59 (2) Non-exempt employees.

60 A. A nonexempt employee who works the holiday as a part of his regular  
61 schedule shall receive his regular wage for that day and, in addition, he shall be paid an  
62 additional full day's pay as holiday pay.

63 B. A nonexempt employee who is not regularly scheduled to work on a holiday,  
64 but is summoned for emergency work on the holiday shall receive a full day's pay  
65 as holiday pay, and in addition thereto, one and one-half times his regular hourly rate  
66 for the hours worked.

67 C. Compensatory time option: A nonexempt employee who works  
68 a holiday may elect to accrue, with the approval of his department head, in lieu  
69 of holiday pay as provided for in this section, a corresponding amount of compensatory  
70 time, provided that the election is made within the pay period containing the holiday and  
71 further provided that the compensatory time is taken within the next ensuing 180 days  
72 after the holiday. If the compensatory time is not taken within 180 days, the  
73 compensatory time shall be converted back to holiday pay and paid to the employee.  
74

75 (d) For the purpose of this section, "nonexempt" employee means an employee who  
76 occupies a position or classification designated as nonexempt pursuant to the Federal  
77 Fair Labor Standards Act as adopted by and through City ordinance.  
78

79 (e) For the purpose of this section, the legal or declared holidays shall be  
80 considered as being from 12:00 o'clock midnight to the following 12:00 o'clock midnight.  
81

82 Section 3. Council hereby authorizes the Mayor to enter into Memoranda of  
83 Understanding with the City's bargaining units for the observation of Juneteenth as a  
84 holiday in 2024.  
85

86 Section 4. Any ordinances or resolutions or portions of ordinances and resolutions  
87 inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed, but any ordinances and resolutions not  
88 inconsistent herewith and which have not previously been repealed are hereby ratified  
89 and confirmed.  
90

91 Section 5. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council  
92 concerning and relating to the passage of this ordinance were taken in an open meeting  
93 of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any committees that  
94 resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with  
95 all requirements including Chapter 107 of the Codified Ordinances.

8 A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE MONTH OF MAY AS ALS  
9 AWARENESS MONTH IN THE CITY OF CUYAHOGA FALLS,  
10 AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

11  
12 WHEREAS, Amyotrophic lateral sclerosis (ALS), known by many as Lou Gehrig’s  
13 disease, is a progressive fatal neurodegenerative disease in which a person’s brain loses  
14 connection with the muscles, slowly taking away their ability to walk, talk, eat, and  
15 eventually breathe; and

16  
17 WHEREAS, every 90 minutes someone is diagnosed with ALS and someone passes  
18 away from ALS; and

19  
20 WHEREAS, on average, patients diagnosed with ALS only survive two to five years from  
21 the time of diagnosis; and

22  
23 WHEREAS, ALS has no cure; and

24  
25 WHEREAS, securing access to new therapies, durable medical equipment, and  
26 communication technologies is of vital importance to people living with ALS; and

27  
28 WHEREAS, the ALS Association, as the largest philanthropic funder of ALS research  
29 globally, has committed over \$154 million to support more than 550 projects across the  
30 United States and 18 other countries; and

31  
32 WHEREAS, the ALS Association’s commitment to accelerating the pace of discovery  
33 remains unwavering, fueled by the hope that one day, ALS will be a livable disease for  
34 everyone, everywhere, until there is a cure; and

35  
36 WHEREAS, ALS Awareness Month increases the public's awareness of people with  
37 ALS’ dire circumstances, and acknowledges the terrible impact this disease has, not only  
38 on the person but on his or her family and the community, and recognizes the research  
39 being done to eradicate this disease.

41 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls,  
42 County of Summit and State of Ohio, that:

44 Section 1. The Council and Administration hereby declare the month of May as ALS  
45 Awareness Month in the City of Cuyahoga Falls and call upon all Americans to join in  
46 supporting ALS research, advocating for increased funding, and standing in solidarity  
47 with those affected by this relentless disease.

49 Section 2. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council  
50 concerning and relating to the adoption of this resolution were adopted in an open  
51 meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its  
52 committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in  
53 compliance with all legal requirements including Chapter 107 of the Codified Ordinances.

57        Section 3. This resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary  
58 for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety, convenience and welfare of the  
59 City of Cuyahoga Falls and the inhabitants thereof and provided it receives the affirmative
