ORDINANCE NO. - 2025

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC SERVICE TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT OR CONTRACTS, WITHOUT COMPETITIVE BIDDING, WITH S & S EXCAVATING INC. FOR THE MAINTENANCE AND REPAIR OF THE CITY'S STORM WATER, SANITARY SEWER, AND WATER DISTRIBUTION SYSTEMS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the quantity of outstanding work related to water service lines, sanitary laterals, and sanitary and storm mains is more than can be handled in a timely manner by City personnel.

WHEREAS, S & S Excavating Inc. is able to complete the work in a timely and workmanlike manner.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County of Summit, and State of Ohio, that:

<u>Section 1.</u> The Director of Public Service is hereby authorized to enter into a contract or contracts, without competitive bidding, with S & S Excavating Inc. for the maintenance and repair of the City's storm water, sanitary sewer, and water distribution systems.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Director of Finance is hereby authorized to make payment for same from the Water Fund, Sewage and Disposal Fund, Storm Drainage Utility Fund, line item Other Operations, and line item Capital Outlay.

<u>Section 3.</u> Any other ordinances or resolutions or portions of ordinances and resolutions inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed, but any ordinances and resolutions not inconsistent herewith and which have not previously been repealed are hereby ratified and confirmed.

<u>Section 4.</u> It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Chapter 107 of the Codified Ordinances.

<u>Section 5.</u> This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety, convenience and welfare of the City of Cuyahoga Falls and the inhabitants thereof, and provided it receives the affirmative vote of two thirds of the members elected or appointed to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest period allowed by law.

A RESOLUTION EXPRESSING SUPPORT FOR AND URGING THE PASSAGE OF ISSUE 1, THE COUNTY OF SUMMIT ALCOHOL, DRUG ADDICTION AND MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES (ADM) BOARD RENEWAL AND INCREASE LEVY AT THE GENERAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON NOVEMBER 4, 2025, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the members of Administration and City Council are committed to ensure that citizens of Cuyahoga Falls have a healthy community in which a continuum of care supports mental wellness and freedom from addiction; and

WHEREAS, the County of Summit ADM Board levy is a six-year, 2.95 mil renewal with an increase of 0.5 mill for each \$1 of taxable value, which amounts to \$75 for each \$100,000.00 of the County Fiscal Officer's appraised value; and

WHEREAS, the County of Summit ADM Board's services impact over 350,000 people per year, from children through older adults; and

WHEREAS, 77% of the organization's operating budget comes from the local levy, of which 94% is spent on direct treatment, community education and outreach; and

WHEREAS, the need for access to 24-hour crisis services, residential treatment and recovery support for people diagnosed with mental illness and addiction is a critical need to keep our community safe and healthy; and

WHEREAS, this Administration and City Council desires to express its support for the proposed renewal levy for the County of Summit ADM Board, and urges the citizens of Cuyahoga Falls to vote YES on Issue 1 at the November 4, 2025, General Election.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County of Summit and State of Ohio, that:

The City Council and Administration express their support for the County of Summit ADM Board's Renewal Levy and urge the passage of Issue 1 at the November 4, 2025 general election.

It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning Section 2. and relating to the adoption of this resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Chapter 107 of the Codified Ordinances.

A RESOLUTION EXPRESSING SUPPORT FOR AND URGING PASSAGE OF ISSUE 52, THE CUYAHOGA FALLS CITY SCHOOL DISTRICT RENEWAL LEVY, AT THE GENERAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON NOVEMBER 4, 2025, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Cuyahoga Falls City School District has nine public schools in the City of Cuvahoga Falls and the Village of Silver Lake, serving over 4,000 students; and

WHEREAS, a properly funded public school system is foundational to civic and economic success; and

WHEREAS, the Cuyahoga Falls City School District has caused a proposed levy to be placed on the November 4, 2025 ballot as Issue 52; and

WHEREAS, this levy is a renewal, not an increase, and stays at a rate not exceeding 9.97 mills for each \$1 of taxable value, which amounts to \$191 for each \$100,000 of the county fiscal officer's appraised value, for a continuing period of time, commencing in 2026 and first due in 2027; and

WHEREAS, this Administration and City Council express support for the proposed renewal levy for the Cuyahoga Falls City School District, and urge the citizens of Cuyahoga Falls to vote YES on Issue 52 at the November 4, 2025, General Election.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County of Summit and State of Ohio, that:

Section 1. The Council and Administration express their support for the Cuyahoga Falls City School District renewal levy and urge the passage of Issue 52 at the November 4, 2025 General Election.

Section 2. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including, to the extent applicable, Chapter 107 of the Codified Ordinances.

Section 3. This resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety, convenience and welfare of the City of Cuyahoga Falls and the inhabitants thereof and provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members elected or appointed to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest period allowed by law.
