13 WHEREAS, the real property known as Open Space Block E of the Woodland
14 Preserves Final Subdivision (Parcel #35-06775), (hereinafter "Property") is more
15 particularly described in Exhibit A; and16
17 WHEREAS, the Property was dedicated to the City of Cuyahoga Falls in the
18 Woodland Preserves Final Subdivision Plat and transferred to the City of Cuyahoga

35 Section 1. That the Mayor is hereby authorized to transfer real property known
36 as Open Space Block E in the Woodland Preserves Subdivision, Cuyahoga Falls (Parcel
37 #35-06775) to Kenneth D. Smith for One Dollar (\$1.00) and subject to the deed
38 restrictions set forth in Exhibit B.39
40 Section 2. Any other ordinances and resolutions or portions of ordinances and
41 resolutions inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed, but any ordinances and
42 resolutions or portions of ordinances and resolutions not inconsistent herewith and
43 which have not previously been repealed are hereby ratified and confirmed.44
