7 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 105-2024 TO
8 REFLECT THE TRANSFER OF \$67,000 FROM THE
9 GENERAL FUND TO THE PRINCETON CROSSROADS TIF
10 FUND, AS AN ADVANCE, AND DECLARING AN
11 EMERGENCY.

13 WHEREAS, the City’s independent public accountant audit firm requested a
14 correction to Ordinance 105-2024 to reflect that the original entry should have been
15 recorded as an advance and not a transfer; and

16
17 WHEREAS, the original entry was intended to be an advance from the General Fund
18 to the Princeton Crossroads TIF Fund, but was approved and processed as a transfer in
19 2024; and

20
21 WHEREAS, this discrepancy was not noted until after the 2025 year-end, when 2025
22 financial statements were compiled; and

23
24 WHEREAS, the 2025 final appropriations ordinance authorized the repayment of the
25 advance.

26
27 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls,
28 County of Summit and State of Ohio, that:

29
30 Section 1. Ordinance 105-2024 is hereby amended to reflect the transfer of \$67,000
31 from the General Fund to the Princeton Crossing TIF Fund, as an advance.

32
33 Section 2. Any other ordinances and resolutions or portions of ordinances and
34 resolutions inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed, but any ordinances and
35 resolutions or portions of ordinances and resolutions not inconsistent herewith and
36 which have not previously been repealed are hereby ratified and confirmed.

37
38 Section 3. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council
39 concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open
40 meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its
41 committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in
42 compliance with all legal requirements, to the extent applicable, including Chapter 107
43 of the Codified Ordinances.

44
45 Section 4. This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary
46 for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety, convenience and welfare of the
47 City of Cuyahoga Falls and the inhabitants thereof, and provided it receives the
48 affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members elected or appointed to Council, it shall take
49 effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise
50 it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest period allowed by law.

8 AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE DIRECTOR OF
9 PUBLIC SERVICE TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT OR
10 CONTRACTS, ACCORDING TO LAW, FOR OVERHEAD
11 POWER LINE CLEARANCE SERVICES, INCLUDING TREE
12 MAINTENANCE, TREE AND BRUSH REMOVAL SERVICES,
13 AND MOWING, FOR A PERIOD NOT TO EXCEED THREE
14 YEARS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

15
16 WHEREAS, tree maintenance by power lines is required to help increase overhead
17 power line service reliability.

18
19 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls,
20 County of Summit, and State of Ohio, that:

21
22 Section 1. The Director of Public Service is hereby authorized to enter into a contract
23 or contracts, according to law, for overhead power line clearance services, including tree
24 maintenance, tree and brush removal services, and mowing, for a period not to exceed
25 three years.

26
27 Section 2. The Director of Finance is hereby authorized to make payment for same
28 from the Electric Fund, line item Other Operations.

29
30 Section 3. Any other ordinances and resolutions or portions of ordinances and
31 resolutions inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed but any ordinances and resolutions
32 or portions of ordinances and resolutions not inconsistent herewith and which have not
33 been previously repealed are hereby ratified and confirmed.

34
35 Section 4. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning
36 and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this
37 Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that
38 resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with

8 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE TRAFFIC CONTROL
9 FILE, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

10
11 WHEREAS, site-specific traffic control regulations of the City are established and
12 maintained in the "Traffic Control File," a document established and maintained by the
13 Chief of Police pursuant to Chapter 305 of the Codified Ordinances; and

14
15 WHEREAS, Section 305.02 of said Chapter requires that amendments to the Traffic
16 Control File be made only through legislation passed by City Council.

17
18 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls,
19 County of Summit, and State of Ohio, that:

20
21 Section 1. Upon the recommendation of the Traffic Committee, the Traffic Control File
22 is hereby amended as follows:

23
24 Amending the Traffic Control File to prohibit parking on the even (west) side of 2nd
25 Street, from Falls Avenue to Francis Avenue.

26
27 Amending the Traffic Control File to remove the parking prohibition on the odd
28 (east) side of 2nd Street, from Falls Avenue to Francis Avenue.

29
30 Amending the Traffic Control File to remove the center two-way turn lane on 2nd
31 Street, from Chestnut Boulevard to Francis Avenue.

32
33 Section 2. The Chief of Police is hereby authorized to note in the Traffic Control File
34 the proper legends.

35
36 Section 3. The Mayor or his designee is hereby authorized to cause the installation
37 or removal of the proper signage reflecting the above amendments.

38
39 Section 4. Any other ordinances and resolutions or portions of ordinances and
40 resolutions inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed but any ordinances and resolutions
41 or portions of ordinances and resolutions not inconsistent herewith and which have not
42 been previously repealed are hereby ratified and confirmed.

43
44 Section 5. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning
