New Ordinances & Resolutions

Temp. Ord. A-71

An ordinance authorizing and approving the Final Plat for a residential conservation overlay subdivision for Park Ridge Preserve, and declaring an emergency.

Temp. Ord. A-72

An ordinance authorizing the Director of Public Service to execute a modification of Contract No. 9464 with Spano Bros. Construction, and declaring an emergency.

Temp. Ord. A-73

An ordinance amending Chapter 505 “Animals and Fowl” of the Cuyahoga Falls Codified Ordinances, and declaring an emergency.

Temp. Res. A-74

A resolution expressing support for and urging the passage of Issue 6, a proposed tax levy for the Cuyahoga Falls City School District, at the General Election to be held on November 3, 2026, and declaring an emergency.

An ordinance authorizing the Director of Public Service to enter into a contract or contracts, according to law, with LightShift Energy for a 10-megawatt battery energy storage system, and declaring an emergency.

An ordinance authorizing the Director of Public Service to enter into a contract or contracts, according to law, for the repair and resurfacing of Hudson Drive from Front Street to Graham Road, and declaring an emergency.

Community Development:

Temp. Ord. A-68

An ordinance authorizing the Director of Community Development to terminate the Community Reinvestment Area Agreement with JPKM Investments, LLC, as approved by Ordinance No. 53-2026, and declaring an emergency.

Temp. Res. A-69

A resolution amending Resolution No. 3-2026 to reflect the termination of the amended Community Reinvestment Area Agreement with JPKM Investments, LLC, and declaring an emergency.
