Public service and public facilities improvements were the highlights of program year 2025. These projects included the following:

- **Literacy Program:** Funds were utilized for a literacy program through the public library. The "Library of Things" was expanded, benefiting 7,268 low-to-moderate-income residents.
- **Senior Nutrition:** Funds provided meals to 18 homebound senior citizens through the "More Than Meals on Wheels for Cuyahoga Falls Seniors" program.
- **Senior Assistance:** In the 2025 program year, 100 senior or disabled residents received vouchers to remove barriers and improve mobility during severe winter weather.
- **Mobility Safety:** In program year 2025, the City of Cuyahoga Falls purchased strobe-lighted flags for attachment to mobility aids. This program increased visibility for 85 disabled seniors, allowing them to cross busy intersections safely.
- **Food Security:** Funds were provided to Cuyahoga Falls Good Neighbors to assist with the increased need for food and self-care items for 1,482 residents facing food insecurity.
- **ADA Accessibility:** ADA-compliant turf was installed at City Hall, providing safe courtyard accessibility for disabled residents, visitors, and employees. In addition, an ADA-compliant switchback project at the RiverLoop began in program year 2025 and will be completed in program year 2026. The newly installed cement ramp removes an architectural barrier, allowing disabled and senior residents and visitors access to riverfront events and newly improved boardwalk.

The City also utilized funding to help prevent homelessness, increase fair housing standards, provide minor housing rehabilitation to income-qualified households, and creating jobs through assistance to local businesses. These projects included the following:

- **Homelessness Prevention:** Funds served as a local match for the Homeless Management Information System (HMIS), which operates county-wide housing support tracking technology. Additionally, the City participated in the 2025 Point-in-Time Count, providing data to the Department of Housing and Urban Development regarding unsheltered individuals in Summit County.
- **Housing Rehabilitation:** The minor housing rehabilitation program was used to rehabilitate 2 income-qualified homes in program year 2025.
- **Fair Housing:** The City utilized CDBG funds to address fair housing issues and prevent discrimination. In program year 2025, discrimination complaint services, audits, landlord-tenant counseling, and outreach services were provided to 154 residents.
- **Economic Development:** Lastly, economic development funds were used to assist 5 businesses including 1 facade grant. This funding created or retained more than eight full-time equivalent jobs for low-to-moderate-income individuals.

Assessment of the Use of Funds

The City of Cuyahoga Falls prioritized its CDBG allocations toward activities identified as High Priority within the Strategic Plan: **Housing Preservation and Public Infrastructure/Accessibility.**

- **Housing Preservation (High Priority):** By dedicating funds to the Minor Home Rehabilitation Grant Program, the City addressed the critical objective of maintaining the existing affordable housing stock. The shift to a grant-based model prevented the displacement of vulnerable residents and addressed immediate health and safety hazards.

- **Public Infrastructure (High Priority):** The City's investment in ADA compliant turf aligns with the objective of removing architectural barriers and ensuring equitable access to city assets. By funding this project, the City is utilizing CDBG resources to provide a solution for disabled citizens and visitors, ensuring that the courtyard is safe and accessible to everyone who visits and/or works at City Hall. Additionally, the RiverLoop ADA Ramp project, begun in program year 2025, is almost completed, allowing visitors and residents with mobility issues to access entertainment areas and the newly improved boardwalk.
- **Public Services:** Funds were strategically used to support a high volume of residents through low-cost, high-impact programs (such as senior snow removal for snow related weather events and community services such as meals on wheels). This addressed the objective of providing essential "quality of life" supports to the elderly, disabled and low-to-moderate income populations.

The City's expenditure reflects a commitment to the Strategic Plan's core philosophy: stabilizing neighborhoods through home repair while ensuring that public spaces and services are accessible to all residents.

Narrative

In PY2025, CDBG-funded programs assisted 13,026 individuals, supporting the City’s objective to provide universal access for all eligible residents to essential services and resources. The City administers all programs in strict accordance with HUD’s national objectives, ensuring that assistance for housing, public services, and infrastructure is allocated based on verified eligibility and documented community need. These efforts were successfully deployed to low- and moderate-income areas, with beneficiary data demonstrating that service delivery remains consistent with the local demographic profile and established program benchmarks.

Narrative

In the 2025 Program Year, the City of Cuyahoga Falls managed a total of \$1,412,701 in available CDBG resources, including the annual entitlement, revolving loan funds, and prior-year carryover funds. During this period, the City successfully expended \$1,105,009, demonstrating a high rate of investment in community-wide priorities.

The remaining balance of \$307,692 consists of funds already obligated to several critical, ongoing initiatives slated for completion in the upcoming year. These include the final construction phase of the RiverLoop ADA Switchback, and the continuation of the Minor Home Rehabilitation grant program.

Additionally, a portion of these funds is dedicated to a public art initiative. To ensure the most effective use of federal resources, these projects are purposefully focused within federally designated low- and moderate-income areas city-wide.

Narrative

CDBG resources are allocated city-wide to assist qualifying low- and moderate-income (LMI) households and neighborhoods. Housing rehabilitation assistance is provided to individuals based on verified household income eligibility. Additionally, public facility, infrastructure, and community art projects are prioritized within federally designated LMI census tracts to satisfy national objective area-benefit criteria.

Leveraging

The City of Cuyahoga Falls utilizes a diversified funding strategy to maximize the impact of federal Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) allocations. By coordinating CDBG resources with non-federal and inter-jurisdictional programs, the City ensures the financial sustainability of critical development initiatives.

- **Economic Development:** The City provides various matching grants to new and expanding businesses to support the national objective of job creation for low-and moderate-income (LMI) individuals. These CDBG-funded incentives are strategically leveraged with private business equity and bank financing to address funding gaps.
- **Housing and Lead Safety:** The City coordinates with the Summit County Public Health Department to integrate CDBG housing rehabilitation efforts with the Lead Hazard Reduction Program. This partnership leverages federal lead abatement funds and state-level lead tax credits to provide comprehensive remediation for homes built before 1978 with children under the age of six.
- **Public Service Partnerships:** Subrecipients of CDBG public service grants are required to leverage CDBG funds with alternative resources, including state grants and private donations. Organizations such as food pantries and senior service providers further maximize this investment through significant volunteer contributions, ensuring federal support is deeply integrated with local community aid networks.

Discuss the difference between goals and outcomes and problems encountered in meeting these goals.

Overview

The City of Cuyahoga Falls addresses affordable housing needs primarily through its Minor Home Rehabilitation Grant Program. This program provides grants of up to \$30,000 to income-eligible homeowners to address essential health, safety, and code-related repairs. By focusing on the preservation of existing housing stock, the City ensures that low- and moderate-income residents can remain in safe and sustainable housing.

Goals vs. Outcomes

During this reporting period, the City established a 1-year goal to support 3 households through the rehabilitation of existing units. The actual accomplishment for the period was 2 households.

Discussion of Challenges and Problems Encountered

While the City remains committed to its housing goals, several administrative and site-specific factors can prevent a project from moving from the "goal" phase to "actual" completion within a single reporting cycle. Primary reasons for such discrepancies typically include:

- **Eligibility and Qualification Hurdles:** The intake process requires strict adherence to federal and local guidelines. Potential activities may not proceed if applicants fail to meet income qualification standards or if legal encumbrances—such as delinquent real estate taxes or city utilities, which render the project ineligible.
- **Project Feasibility and "Walk-Away" Scenarios:** To ensure the responsible use of CDBG funds, the City evaluates each property for long-term viability. A project may be disqualified or the "Walk-Away" policy enacted if the home exhibits extreme instability (such as hoarding or foundation issues) or if the cost of repairs required to meet basic safety standards greatly exceeds the grant cap.

Discuss how these outcomes will impact future annual action plans.

Evaluation of Goals and Future Strategic Planning

The City successfully supported 2 of its 3 targeted households for minor rehabilitation, with the final unit being impacted by common programmatic challenges. While the goal was nearly met, the City plans to collaborate with its program management team to evaluate potential enhancements to the application and intake process for future Annual Action Plans.

The City and its subrecipient may explore more rigorous pre-screening protocols to identify potential "walk-away" scenarios—such as significant foundation instability, hoarding, or repair greatly exceeding the \$30,000 grant cap—at the earliest possible stage. Additionally, the City intends to discuss the feasibility of deeper upfront vetting for income eligibility, delinquent real estate taxes, and delinquent utilities to ensure that administrative efforts remain focused on projects most likely to reach completion.

The objective of these potential administrative refinements is to further improve "project readiness." By collectively identifying disqualifying factors sooner, the City and its partners could potentially speed up the waiting list, allowing for a more efficient transition to the next viable applicant. This proactive approach ensures that CDBG resources continue to be deployed effectively while maintaining a high standard of service for the community's affordable housing needs.

Narrative Information

Income Eligibility and Program Outcomes

During this reporting period, the City’s Minor Home Rehabilitation Grant program successfully served 2 extremely low-income households. While the initial goal was to assist 3 households, the City remains committed to prioritizing those with the greatest financial need and ensuring that federal funds are used for sustainable repairs.

The variance between the goal and the actual outcome highlights the inherent complexities of home rehabilitation. Moving forward, the City looks forward to collaborating with its housing department inspectors and its housing subrecipient to effectively identify walk-away scenarios and income eligibility red flags earlier in the process so that administrative efforts remain focused on projects with the highest probability of completion. Project readiness refinements may allow for more efficient transition to the next eligible applicant, speeding up the waitlist for this very popular program.

Reaching out to homeless persons (especially unsheltered persons) and assessing their individual needs

The City of Cuyahoga Falls, Community Development Department addresses homeless outreach through staff participation in the Summit County Continuum of Care (CoC), staff participation in the development of policies for the local HMIS, the CoC Advisory Board, and annual Point-in-Time Counts. The Akron, Barberton/Summit County CoC Point-in-Time Count was held on Tuesday, January 30, 2025.

Addressing the emergency shelter and transitional housing needs of homeless persons

Summit County has a limited amount of shelter beds available to those experiencing homelessness; the majority of those available are inside the City of Akron. The 2 largest shelters, Haven of Rest and ACCESS, are located within the City of Akron. Haven of Rest is the primary shelter for males experiencing homelessness and ACCESS, Harvest Home, and the Battered Women's shelter primarily serve women and their children. Shelter Care provides shelter for unaccompanied youth ages 10 through 17. HM Life Opportunity Services (HMLoS), the Ohio Multi-County Development Corporation (OMCDC), Community Support Services, Haven of Rest, Battered Women's Shelter, Legacy II, and Summit County Children Services provide transitional housing beds within the community and prioritize those being served in their programs by taking referrals directly from shelters or those living on the streets or target those with the greatest needs, such as those suffering from alcohol or substance abuse and those with mental health issues.

Helping low-income individuals and families avoid becoming homeless, especially extremely low-income individuals and families and those who are: likely to become homeless after being discharged from publicly funded institutions and systems of care (such as health care facilities, mental health facilities, foster care and other youth facilities, and corrections programs and institutions); and, receiving assistance from public or private agencies that address housing, health, social services, employment, education, or youth needs

The CoC has beds dedicated to the chronic homeless population, including several programs that adopt a housing first model designed to triage chronic homelessness with housing as the first step towards stabilization. Chronically homeless persons are prioritized for referral to these permanent housing beds, and the CoC hopes to meet the federal goal of ending chronic homelessness in the community. The Summit CoC and its central intake follow HUD policies regarding prioritization for those requiring housing assistance, including placement of individuals with multiple barriers to otherwise secure housing. Once housed, residents can receive treatment for issues such as substance abuse and mental

illness or physical problems that often keep a person homeless.

The CoC has adopted the policies set forth by HUD Release CPD-14-012, issued July 28, 2014, which sets a guideline for placement in CoC housing according to applicant need. Beds within the CoC housing stock should be prioritized for applicants who are chronically homeless and/or have multiple barriers to achieving housing stability. Moreover, the HUD release advises communities to rededicate Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) beds to those who fit the criteria for classification as chronically homeless. Through the use of central intake, applicants will be assessed with a vulnerability index to determine those with the greatest need for PSH or transitional housing. Those with the highest needs will be prioritized for available PSH beds and programs. Applicants with lower needs or barriers will be referred to programs such as Rapid Re-Housing and Homeless Prevention for short-term assistance designed to bridge the gap from a temporary crisis to housing stability. Currently, Summit County is operating (HPRP) for those individuals in a shelter or facing eviction from existing housing. Additionally, RRHP programs for veterans and veteran families are being operated within the county. HPRP programs combine short-term assistance up to 9 months and case management and life skills programming designed to help residents stabilize from a housing crisis. Summit County has designated CoC beds for homeless young adults and young adults emancipating from Children Services' custody. It is worth noting that the need for all these types of housing programs far exceeds the current supply.

Helping homeless persons (especially chronically homeless individuals and families, families with children, veterans and their families, and unaccompanied youth) make the transition to permanent housing and independent living, including shortening the period of time that individuals and families experience homelessness, facilitating access for homeless individuals and families to affordable housing units, and preventing individuals and families who were recently homeless from becoming homeless again

Summit County relies on the aforementioned CoC housing stock to address the needs of those persons emerging from public institutions, health care centers, or emancipating from foster care. These persons often face a lengthy wait period between their discharge and the availability of housing, leaving them in a vulnerable state for recidivism and exploitation. Some faith-based organizations exist to serve a small percentage of those persons re-entering from corrections facilities, but there are often long wait lists for these beds. The Summit County community operates various hotlines and support groups to connect people with services and opportunities that are available, but those resources remain very limited.

CR-30 - Public Housing 91.220(h); 91.320(j)

Actions taken to address the needs of public housing

The City of Cuyahoga Falls does not own or directly operate public housing. Instead, the Akron Metropolitan Housing Authority (AMHA) serves as the designated Public Housing Authority (PHA) for the Summit County region. The City maintains a collaborative partnership with AMHA to address community housing needs and ensure the provision of fair housing services.

Under a formal Memorandum of Understanding (MOU), the City performs essential environmental reviews for AMHA's public housing properties. These reviews are a critical administrative requirement that enables AMHA to secure HUD grant funding for the ongoing maintenance and rehabilitation of its housing portfolio.

Actions taken to encourage public housing residents to become more involved in management and participate in homeownership

- Encouragement & Enrollment: AMHA residents in both Public Housing and the Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) program were encouraged to voluntarily enroll to achieve economic independence.
- Goal Setting (ITSP): Participants worked with an FSS Coordinator to create an Individual Training and Services Plan (ITSP) with targeted employment and financial goals.
- Escrow Account: As a resident's earned income increased, a portion of their corresponding rent increase was deposited into an interest-bearing escrow account, which they could access upon successful graduation.
- Financial Literacy & Homeownership: AMHA partnered with local organizations like the Financial Empowerment Center to provide required financial management classes and homebuyer education.

Actions taken to provide assistance to troubled PHAs

AMHA Status and Evaluation

Troubled Designation: In PY 2025, the Akron Metropolitan Housing Authority (AMHA) was not designated as a "troubled" Public Housing Agency (PHA) by HUD.

- Under HUD's Public Housing Assessment System (PHAS), a "troubled" designation is given to agencies with a score of less than 60%.
- AMHA operated as a "Standard" or "High Performer" during this period, with an occupancy rate of approximately 97.23% as of June 2025.

City Responsibility: The City of Cuyahoga Falls is not responsible for the administration or oversight of PHA funds.

- These funds are provided directly by HUD to the PHA to cover program costs and administrative fees.
- Because the City does not manage these federal subsidies, it does not perform its own independent evaluation of the PHA's operational status or physical condition.

The City of Cuyahoga Falls is committed to expanding the housing supply and ensuring that housing is decent, safe, and sanitary. Through the CDBG program, the City provides minor home rehabilitation to address essential health and safety repairs and promote housing stability for residents. Furthermore, the City works to mitigate regulatory burdens that can hinder housing production, partnering with Community-Based Development Organizations to facilitate attainable homeownership and ensure fair access to the housing market.

Actions taken to address obstacles to meeting underserved needs. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

To address documented community needs, the City focuses on expanding the housing supply and maintaining high-quality housing stock for low- and moderate-income (LMI) residents. The primary challenge remains the high cost of property maintenance and the limited availability of attainable units. To bridge this gap, the City utilizes CDBG funds for Homeowner Rehabilitation, targeting critical health and safety upgrades. The City also works to streamline local processes to encourage the development of new units, partnering with organizations like Habitat for Humanity to foster sustainable homeownership as a pathway to economic self-sufficiency.

Actions taken to reduce lead-based paint hazards. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

In 2025, the City engaged Neighborhood Development Services (NDS) to administer its owner-occupied minor home rehabilitation program. NDS employs 2 licensed lead risk assessors and 2 licensed lead abatement contractors, all of which have an EPA RRP Certification. NDS is responsible for all 3rd party risk assessments and lead paint inspections. If lead-based paint is suspected to be present, NDS is required to inspect, test, and ensure all lead abatement is undertaken and performed in compliance with EPA and HUD regulations by a lead-abatement certified contractor.

During the 2025 program year, there were no qualifying lead hazard cases in Cuyahoga Falls referred to Summit County for abatement under their lead-hazard control grant.

For program year 2025 through program year 2027, the City has an executed Memorandum of Understanding with Summit County for their Combined General Health District Lead Based Hazard Control Program, to help ensure that the City leverages all federal funds when applicable.

Actions taken to reduce the number of poverty-level families. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

As a partner agency of the Summit County Continuum of Care (CoC), the City participates in the Homeless Management System (HMIS) to ensure a collection of reliable data regarding the use of homeless programs. All homeless service agencies throughout Summit County, regardless of their funding source, submit data to be entered into this system to ensure that agency partners are able to have a better understanding of homelessness in order to assess whether additional services and/or improvements are needed in the future. United Way of Summit County is the host agency for this system and utilizes its 2-1-1 information line to help provide resources to individuals throughout Summit County. The 2-1-1 information line is able to provide resource information to individuals including food assistance programs, substance abuse treatment, mental health programs, and disaster relief services. In 2025, the City provided a match of \$5,000 in CDBG funds to assist with this program.

The City also provided assistance to businesses to create and/or maintain jobs for low-to-moderate income individuals.

Actions taken to develop institutional structure. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

The Development Department is responsible for the administration of the CDBG program throughout the City, integrating all planning and projects with the goals established in the Five-Year Consolidated Plan. The Department maintains active community engagement through public meetings, website updates, and direct communication to ensure transparency in the planning and implementation of programs. To ensure the efficient use of taxpayer resources, the City does not duplicate the services of other established and successful programs. This results in a strong, well-coordinated institutional structure that maximizes impact while eliminating redundant administrative costs.

Actions taken to enhance coordination between public and private housing and social service agencies. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

The City will continue to collaborate with community-based organizations and non-profits to provide essential services that support the housing and stability needs of low-and moderate-income residents. Our ongoing partnership with Habitat for Humanity focuses on identifying future sites to expand the supply of decent, safe, and sanitary housing units throughout the City.

Additionally, the City remains committed to its partnership with the Summit County Land Reutilization Corporation to identify underutilized or delinquent properties. By securing these assets for restoration and rehabilitation, we help return them to productive use and stabilize our local neighborhoods. The City also works with designated agencies to ensure fair access to the housing market and other critical supports that foster self-sufficiency. Finally, the Akron Metropolitan Housing Authority (AMHA) will continue to manage public housing programs, with the City providing assistance as needed to ensure the efficient delivery of services.

The City identifies the high cost of property maintenance and a limited housing supply as primary challenges to housing choice for low- and moderate-income (LMI) residents. To address these, the City utilizes CDBG funds for minor home rehabilitation, ensuring that existing housing stock remains decent, safe, and sanitary.

Furthermore, the City of Cuyahoga Falls is committed to expanding the housing supply through strategic property acquisition and disposition. The City identifies appropriate sites to facilitate the development of new, attainable housing units by using CDBG funding to acquire underutilized or vacant properties. These properties are provided to qualified Community-Based Development Organizations (CBDOs), such as Habitat for Humanity, to return land to productive use and create sustainable housing opportunities for LMI households.

Describe the standards and procedures used to monitor activities carried out in furtherance of the plan and used to ensure long-term compliance with requirements of the programs involved, including minority business outreach and the comprehensive planning requirements

The Development Department conducts an on-site monitoring review for each subrecipient at least once per program year. These reviews ensure that performance goals are achieved and that all activities are executed in strict accordance with the terms of the written subrecipient agreement. Furthermore, each subrecipient is required to submit an annual independent audit to the City to ensure fiscal accountability and compliance with federal accounting standards.

To promote inclusive procurement and economic opportunity, the City of Cuyahoga Falls actively facilitates outreach to Minority Business Enterprises (MBE) and Women Business Enterprises (WBE). This includes targeted advertising through the Akron Urban League and the integration of minority-owned firms into the minor home rehabilitation contractor pool. These efforts are formalized under the City's MBE/WBE Participation Plan, which provides a structured framework for technical assistance, low-interest financing, and matching grants.

In coordination with the Greater Akron Chamber and Summit County, the City performs regular business retention and expansion visits. These engagements focus on providing technical resources to local firms to support workforce development and the retention of a diverse, skilled labor force within the region.

Citizen Participation Plan 91.105(d); 91.115(d)

Describe the efforts to provide citizens with reasonable notice and an opportunity to comment on performance reports.

In accordance with the City's Citizen Participation Plan and federal regulations under 24 CFR 91.105(d), the City provides residents with reasonable notice and the opportunity to comment on its annual performance reports. Each year, a draft of the Consolidated Annual Performance and Evaluation Report (CAPER) is published on the City's official website for public review.

To ensure broad awareness, the City publishes a legal notice in the Akron Beacon Journal, a newspaper of general circulation. Supplemental outreach is conducted via the City's official social media platforms to further facilitate community engagement. The draft performance report is made available for a public comment period of no less than 15 calendar days. All written comments received during this period are carefully considered, and a summary of these comments, along with the City's responses, is included as an addendum to the final report submitted to HUD.

Nature of and Reasons for Program Changes

During Program Year 2025, the City redirected a portion of its CDBG resources toward critical infrastructure and public facility enhancements to ensure full alignment with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and HUD’s national objectives. This strategic shift prioritized the removal of physical barriers and the modernization of public spaces to provide universal access for all residents and visitors.

RiverLoop Infrastructure Project: The primary focus was the completion of the RiverLoop ADA switchback. This structural improvement provides a compliant, accessible route connecting the riverfront entertainment district to the newly rebuilt boardwalk. By replacing non-standard pathways with an engineered switchback, the City has ensured that residents with mobility challenges have equal opportunity to navigate and utilize these public recreational assets.

Public Safety Facility Enhancements: The City also implemented safety and accessibility upgrades at the Police Department courtyard. This included the installation of ADA-compliant specialized turf, creating a firm and stable surface for all individuals. These improvements ensure that both employees and members of the public can safely and consistently access this civic space.

Impact: These infrastructure investments directly address documented architectural barriers as defined by the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). By prioritizing the removal of these physical impediments, the City has ensured that public facilities—including the RiverLoop and the Police Department courtyard—meet federal accessibility standards. These improvements provide consistent, barrier-free access for residents with mobility impairments, ensuring that City-funded infrastructure is functionally accessible to all.
