





Home Health & Safety Tips

- Smoke detectors should be located on every level of your home and inside each bedroom. Replace batteries twice a year. Some newer smoke detector models have 10-year batteries.
- Carbon monoxide (CO) detectors are lifesavers, too! CO alarms will notify inhabitants if a defective heater burning natural gas, propane, oil, wood or kerosene is emitting this odorless gas into your home.
- Have your home tested for radon. Radon is a radioactive gas that exists naturally in soil and can enter your home through basement cracks, joints and gaps. Concentrated levels of radon can lead to serious health issues.
- Keep the area around your heating system clear and make sure your heating system is properly vented to the outside to prevent CO buildup indoors. Never store combustibles near a furnace.





CITY OF CUYAHOGA FALLS Water Utilities Division

he Cuyahoga Falls Water Department staff ensures that water distribution, sanitary sewer and storm sewer collection systems are properly maintained every day. Emergencies within these systems are addressed immediately, 24/7. Cuyahoga Falls Water Treatment Plant operators are all EPA certified in water supply systems and main-

tain water plant operations around the clock.

Stormwater Management

Through an inspection, the Stormwater Management division of the Water Department can assist with identifying and eliminating inflow and infiltration of clean water into the sanitary sewer system which can cause basement backups during heavy rain events.

Hydrant Flushing

Cuyahoga Falls holds the excellent Class III fire insurance rating as issued by the Insurance Services Office of Ohio. Fire hydrants throughout the community are flushed annually during the months of June and July to ensure that they operate safely and efficiently.





he City of Cuyahoga Falls Engineering Department is responsible for the design and construction of all public improvement projects including street paving, storm sewers, sanitary sewers, and water lines. The Engineering Department assigns house numbers and issues permits for construction



in street right-of-ways for excavation, sidewalk and drive approach, curb cutting, downspout openings and water service connections.

The Engineering Department is also a repository for all allotment plot plans and underground utility maps, and has on file Summit County tax maps and federal government flood plain maps. To keep our program going strong, it is critical that all citizens place only acceptable recyclable materials into recycle carts. The Recycle Guide featured on this page ensures that your household is recycling responsibly.

Responsible Recycling of Yard Waste in Cuyahoga Falls

In Ohio, it's illegal to put yard waste into landfills. Prohibited materials in yard waste carts and bags drive up costs, damage machinery and slow production. The proper disposal of yard waste drastically reduces, not only the amount of waste that is dumped in our landfills, but also the production of methane, a harmful greenhouse gas.

Guidelines for Recycling Yard Waste in Paper Bags, Yard Carts:

ACCEPTED

- Leaves
- Grass clippings
- Weeds & Brush
- Shrubbery
- Twigs & small branches (less than 4 inches in diameter)

NOT ACCEPTED No trash

- No food/pet waste
- No dirt or rocks
- No plastic bags or bottles
- No sod, soil or root ball No plastic plant pots
- Used mulch





Please do not use plastic bags to collect yard waste. Keep it loose in yard carts or use compostable bags. Yard carts can be obtained by visiting the Utility Billing Department at City Hall at 2310 Second Street.






