


The **Buildings and Grounds Maintenance Department** is responsible for the day-to-day upkeep of City Hall, its surrounding grounds, and implements Adopt-A-Spot, a community beautification program, and the annual spring tree planting program. The department also oversees cemetery services at the four city-owned cemeteries in Cuyahoga Falls namely Oakwood, Northampton, Harrington, and Botzum.

Building and Grounds Maintenance is also responsible for the upkeep of the Cuyahoga Falls Arboretum. Dedicated on April 27, 2012, the Cuyahoga Falls Arboretum is nestled in Kennedy Park and covers a fouracre span on the city's east side which includes Kelsey Creek. In 2016, a master plan was designed with the idea of making the arboretum both an educational space and a walking space for everyone to enjoy.

The Cuyahoga Falls Arboretum offers an opportunity to acknowledge an individual, family, organization, or service club with the planting of a tree through the Shades of Green Project.

It serves as a liaison between the developer, the mayor's office, and the city departments to ensure timely and successful project completion. The coordination of the Merriman Valley - Schumacher Area Master Plan is spearheaded by the department.

The Community Development Department also promotes the marketability of the city through developing and maintaining strong public and private sector relationships to maintain a positive outlook and growth potential for the city. Additionally, they engage the community in outreach meetings and surveys to better understand and address the needs and concerns of the public as a whole.

Utilizing various federal, state, and local programs and funding sources, the Community Development Department coordinates new development, rehabilitation, and maintenance of properties throughout the city.

The **Engineering Department** is responsible for the design and construction of all public improvement projects, including street paving, sewers, and water lines. The department serves as the repository for all allotment plot plans, underground utility maps and has Summit County tax maps and federal government flood plain maps on file.

The Engineering Department assigns house numbers and issues permits for construction in the street or road right-of-way, such as street excavation, sidewalk and drive approach construction, curb cutting, downspout openings, and sanitary sewer lateral and water service connections.

The Engineering Department is proud to research and apply for grant dollars that help fund innovative infrastructure projects, and they utilize public goods funding to replace missing sidewalks to improve connectivity and accessibility for all people.

The City of **Cuyahoga Falls Water System** serves approximately 55,000 people across Cuyahoga Falls, Munroe Falls, and Silver Lake.

The city's water supply comes from 18 drilled wells located in Water Works Park on the south bank of the Cuyahoga River. The Cuyahoga River contributes flow to the aquifer and the wellfield is recharged by means of channels and lagoons. From the wellfield, water is aerated to remove objectionable gases. Chlorine is added for disinfection, fluoride is added for prevention of tooth decay, and caustic soda for corrosion control.

The Cuyahoga Falls sanitary and storm sewers are laid out in separate systems. The storm sewer system conducts storm runoff to the nearest natural watercourse, 152 miles of sanitary sewers ranging in size from 6" to 30" in diameter collect industrial, commercial, and residential waste, which is transported to the Akron Water Pollution Control Facility for treatment.

In 1888, City Council passed a resolution authorizing the Falls Edison Electric Light & Power Co. the right to erect pole lines for the purpose of supplying electric street lighting, which marks the formation of the Cuyahoga Falls Light Department.

Today, the electric division collaborates its power production with American Municipal Power (AMP) and utilizes hydroelectric, wind, and combustion sources to create enough energy to meet the city's residential and commercial amperage needs.

Additionally, the award-winning electric system and its various partnerships provide scholarships, free home energy audits, free home energy kits, appliance rebate programs, and much more. The Electric Department replaced over 4,500 street lights in 2020 with LED lights around the city. LED lights are longer-lasting, more energy-efficient, and increase light ranges to allow for better visibility for drivers and pedestrians.

### WHAT CAN BE RECYCLED?



Plastics: Bottles and jugs where the mouth of the container is smaller than the base. Caps and lids need to be removed, Items should be marked with a 1 or 2 on the bottom.

Metals: Food, beverage, and pet food cans; includes metal, bi-metal, tin, and aluminum.



Glass: Food and beverage jars and bottles.



Paper: Newspapers, magazines, junk mail, telephone books, catalogs, cardboard, paperboard (Cereal Boxes, Beverage & Food Boxes/Cartons), milk cartons & juice boxes. Note: Waxed cardboard is not recycled nor is food contaminated cardboard.

\*All items should be lightly rinsed.

"All boxes and paper bags should be flattened and empty.

This guide explains what is accepted by the recycling center that processes our recycled material. What can be recycled varies from one area to another, therefore, recyclable, does not mean that the item is recyclable everywhere. If it does not fit the above guidelines.

The Cuyahoga Falls **Street Department** is responsible for clearing snow, removing leaves, filling pot-holes, and resurfacing roads. Each fall, the city orchestrates the removal of leaves from its many miles of streets and municipal properties, including 26 neighborhood parks.

Once the leaves have fallen, the city sends leaf crews armed with vacuum machines and rakes to condense the debris, and keep our streets clean.

- In times of heavy snowfall, remove parked cars from city streets so they can be properly plowed.
- Avoid putting snow from driveways or sidewalks into already cleared streets.




