10 INDIVIDUAL HISTORIC OVERLAY LANDMARK AT 1701  
11 SOUTH FRONT STREET ACCORDING TO SECTION  
12 1132.21 H, HISTORIC OVERLAY IN THE CUYAHOGA  
13 FALLS GENERAL DEVELOPMENT CODE, AND  
14 DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.  
15

17 WHEREAS, the Charter of the City of Cuyahoga Falls requires that all decisions  
18 made by the Planning Commission be submitted to Council, and  
19

20 WHEREAS, on March 18, 2014 the Planning Commission recommended  
21 approval for the designation of 1701 South Front Street as an individual historic  
22 overlay landmark according to Section 1132.21 H, Historic Overlay of the  
23 Cuyahoga Falls General Development Code and as outlined in this legislation and  
24 in File P-6-14-H, and  
25

26 WHEREAS, the Planning Commission acted as sole reviewer and approval body  
27 for the creation of this individual historic overlay landmark designation until final  
28 certified local government approval is received by the Ohio Historic Preservation  
29 Office and the National Park Service, and  
30

31 WHEREAS, the Planning Commission based its individual historic overlay  
32 landmark designation for 1701 South Front Street on Section 1132.21 H, Historic  
33 Overlay and Ordinance 18-2014, and  
34

35 WHEREAS, the Planning Commission is recommending that City Council  
36 approve this individual historic overlay landmark designation at 1701 South Front  
37 Street because the structure has special historic and architectural value to the City  
38 of Cuyahoga Falls.  
39

40 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga  
41 Falls, County of Summit, and State of Ohio, that:  
42

43 Section 1. That the City Council approves, in accordance with Cuyahoga Falls  
44 General Development Code regulations as stipulated in the Codified Ordinances of  
45 the City of Cuyahoga Falls and as approved by the Planning Commission as per the  
46 plans and final stipulations contained in File P-6-14-H.  
47

48        Section 2. That Council hereby waives the publication notice and the public  
49 hearing requirements pursuant to Codified Ordinance Section 1132.21 C 2 f (1) of  
50 the Codified Ordinances regarding the text amendments herein.

51  
52        Section 3. That Council approves actions of the Planning Commission in this  
53 matter and waives review and approval by the DHR Board pursuant to Codified  
54 Ordinance Section 1132.21(C) for the creation of this individual historic overlay  
55 landmark designation for the reason that final certified local government approval  
56 has not yet been received by the Ohio Historic Preservation Office and the National  
57 Park Service.

58  
59        Section 4. That any other ordinances or resolutions or portions of ordinances  
60 and resolutions inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed, but any ordinances and  
61 resolutions not inconsistent herewith and which have not previously been repealed  
62 are hereby ratified and confirmed.

63  
64        Section 5. That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this  
65 Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in  
66 an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of  
67 any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to  
68 the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including, to the extent  
69 applicable, Chapter 107 of the Codified Ordinances.

14 WHEREAS the State of Ohio through the Department of Public Safety  
15 administers financial assistance to employers for the purchase of law  
16 enforcement safety equipment, and

18 WHEREAS the City of Cuyahoga Falls desires financial reimbursement  
19 under the Subgrant Program,

20  
21 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of  
22 Cuyahoga Falls, County of Summit and State of Ohio, that:

24 Section 1. The Director of Public Safety is hereby authorized to accept the  
25 Justice Assistance Subgrant financial assistance from the Ohio Department of  
26 Public Safety, on behalf of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, for the purposes set forth  
27 in the grant application and grant agreement.

29 Section 2. The Director of Public Safety is hereby authorized and directed to  
30 enter into agreements that may be necessary to accept the financial assistance  
31 mentioned herein.

33 Section 3. The Director of Finance agrees that it has and will obligate the  
34 funds required to satisfactorily complete the project under the terms and  
35 conditions of the agreement if the project is accepted for financial assistance.

37 Section 4. The Director of Finance is hereby authorized and directed to  
38 increase appropriations in the Law Enforcement Trust Fund, Line Item Capital  
39 Outlay, in the amount of \$14,100 and reduce appropriations in Line Item Other  
40 Operations by \$8,160.

17 Section 1. Section 947.05 of Part Nine, Title Seven, Chapter 947 of the  
18 Cuyahoga Falls Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to provide as follows

21 947.05 BOARD OF REVIEW.

- 22 (a) A Board of Review is hereby created consisting of three members:  
23 one member of Council appointed by the President, the ~~Chairman~~  
24 ~~of the Emergency Medical Services Commission~~ Fire Chief, and the  
25 Director of Law. A majority of the members of the Board shall  
26 constitute a quorum. The Board shall adopt its own procedural  
27 rules and shall keep a record of its transactions.
- 28 (b) Any person dissatisfied with any ruling or decision of the Director  
29 of Finance which is made under the authority conferred by this  
30 chapter may appeal therefrom to the Board of Review within thirty

13 BE IT ORDAINED by the council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County of  
14 Summit, and State of Ohio, that:

15  
16 Section 1. Chapter 767, Part Seven of the Cuyahoga Falls Code of Ordinances is  
17 hereby amended to provide as follows (new text underlined; deleted text in  
18 ~~striketrough~~):

19  
20 767.01 DEFINITIONS.

21 Definitions as used in this chapter shall be as outlined in Section 4765.01 of the  
22 Ohio Revised Code, unless otherwise expressly stated:

- 23 (a) (1) "Emergency Medical Technician-~~Ambulance~~ Basic" or "EMT-  
24 ~~ABasic~~" means a trained or qualified person holding a current,  
25 valid certificate issued under Section 4765.30 of the Ohio Revised  
26 Code to practice as an Emergency Medical Technician-~~Ambulance~~  
27 Basic.
- 28 (2) "~~Advanced~~ Emergency Medical Technician-~~Ambulance~~  
29 Intermediate" or "~~ADV-EMT- AI~~" means a trained or qualified  
30 person holding a current, valid certificate issued under section  
31 4765.30 of the Ohio Revised Code to practice as an ~~Advanced~~  
32 Emergency Medical Technician-~~Ambulance~~ Intermediate.
- 33 (3) "Emergency Medical Technician-Paramedic" means a trained or  
34 qualified person holding a current, valid certificate issued under  
35 Section 4765.30 of the Ohio Revised Code to practice as an  
36 Emergency Medical Technician-Paramedic.
- 37 (b) "Advanced Life Support" or "ALS" means treatment described in Section  
38 4765.39 of the Ohio Revised Code that a Paramedic is certified to  
39 perform.
- 40 (c) "Ambulance" means any privately owned, leased or operated motor  
41 vehicle that is used or intended to be used for the transportation upon  
42 the streets or highways of this City persons who are seriously ill, injured,  
43 wounded, or otherwise incapacitated or helpless, or used for  
44 administering emergency medical service to patients before, during, or  
45 after transportation. "Ambulance" does not include a vehicle designed  
46 and used solely for the transportation of non-stretcher-bound or  
47 handicapped persons, whether ambulatory or confined to a wheelchair.
- 48 (d) "Ambulance Service" means any individual, proprietorship, partnership,  
49 limited partnership, association, joint stock association, company,  
50 corporation, lessee, trustee or receiver owning, controlling, operating or  
51 managing any ambulance or emergency medical service or ambulance  
52 service or ambulance company that uses EMT-~~ABasic~~'S, ~~ADV-EMT-AI~~'S  
53 or Paramedics, or a combination thereof, and ambulances to provide  
54 emergency medical service and transportation to persons who are  
55 seriously ill, injured, wounded, or otherwise incapacitated or helpless.

- 465 (a) The licensee or its employees are guilty of neglect of duty or misconduct;
- 466 (b) ~~The licensee, its employees or equipment cease to meet the requirements~~  
467 ~~of this chapter;~~
- 468 (e) The licensee or its employees fail to comply with the regulations  
469 promulgated by the Mayor upon the advice of the ~~Emergency Medical~~  
470 ~~Services Commission~~ Fire Chief; or
- 471 ~~(d)~~ (c) The licensee, its employees or equipment are otherwise in violation of  
472 this chapter or the Ohio Revised Code.

473 Any decision of the Mayor concerning licensing shall constitute a final  
474 appealable order for purposes of Chapter 2506 of the Ohio Revised Code.

#### 475 767.99 PENALTY.

476 Whoever violates or fails to comply with the provisions of this chapter shall be  
477 deemed guilty of a misdemeanor of the first degree, and fined or imprisoned pursuant to
