8 OFFICER TO MAKE ADVANCE DISTRIBUTION OF TAX  
9 RECEIPTS PAYABLE TO THE CITY OF CUYAHOGA FALLS, AND

12 WHEREAS, Ohio Revised Code §321.33 provides for semi-annual distribution of tax receipts  
13 collected by the County Fiscal Officer and payable to the City of Cuyahoga Falls, and

14  
15 WHEREAS, Ohio Revised Code §321.34 provides that when local authorities by resolution so  
16 request, the County Fiscal Officer shall make advance payment of tax receipts that are in the  
17 county treasury to the credit of the account of the local authority, to the extent such tax receipts  
18 are lawfully applicable to the purpose of the current fiscal year in which the request is made;

19  
20 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County of  
21 Summit and State of Ohio, that:

22  
23 Section 1. In accordance with Ohio Revised Code §321.34, the City of Cuyahoga Falls hereby  
24 requests that the County Fiscal Officer make advance distribution of local tax receipts now in  
25 collection and normally payable in 2016, for the 2015 tax year.

26  
27 Section 2. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and  
28 relating to the adoption of this resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and  
29 that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal  
30 action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including  
31 Chapter 107 of the Codified Ordinances.

32  
33 Section 3. This resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the  
34 preservation of the public peace, health, safety, convenience and welfare of the City of Cuyahoga  
35 Falls and the inhabitants thereof, and provided it received the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the

19 competitive bidding, for expert consulting services related to pending Fact Finding for collective  
20 bargaining.

22 Section 2. The Director of Finance is hereby authorized and directed to make payment for same  
23 from the General Fund, Law Department, Line Item, Other Operations and to increase appropriations  
24 in the General Fund, Law Department, Line Item Other Operations, by \$30,000.00.

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8 AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO  
9 AN AGREEMENT WITH THE FRATERNAL ORDER OF POLICE,  
10 OHIO LABOR COUNCIL, INC. EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2015, AND  
11 DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

13 WHEREAS, Ohio Revised Code Chapter 4117 authorizes public employees to bargain collec-  
14 tively with public employers regarding wages, hours, terms and other conditions of employment  
15 and to enter into collective bargaining agreements; and

16  
17 WHEREAS, the Mayor and his representatives and the Fraternal Order of Police, Ohio Labor  
18 Council, Inc. ("FOP") have bargained collectively and in good faith and said bargaining has result-  
19 ed in a tentative agreement on a collective bargaining agreement effective July 1, 2015; and

20  
21 WHEREAS, on or about November 19, 2015, the membership of the FOP ratified said collec-  
22 tive bargaining agreement.

23  
24 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County  
25 of Summit and State of Ohio, that:

26  
27 Section 1. The Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into a collective bargaining agreement as  
28 negotiated with and ratified by the FOP, effective July 1, 2015.

29  
30 Section 2. Any other ordinances and resolutions or portions of ordinances and resolutions  
31 inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed but any ordinances and resolutions or portions of ordi-  
32 nances and resolutions not inconsistent herewith and which have not previously been repealed  
33 are hereby ratified and confirmed.

34  
35 Section 3. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and  
36 relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and  
37 that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal  
38 action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including
