26 the further purpose of purchasing products, services, materials and supplies through cooperative purchase
27 agreements administered by Sourcing Alliance Network. Competitive bidding requirements which would
28 otherwise be associated with such purchases are hereby waived.
29

30 Section 2. Any other ordinances and resolutions or portions of ordinances and resolutions inconsistent
31 herewith are hereby repealed, but any ordinances and resolutions or portions of ordinances and resolutions not
32 inconsistent herewith and which have not previously been repealed are hereby ratified and confirmed.
33

34 Section 3. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the
35 passage of this ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this
36 Council and of any committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public, in
37 compliance with all legal requirements including Chapter 107 of the Codified Ordinances.

39 Section 4. This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation

14 WHEREAS, the completion of the improvement on the Portage Trail Extension West Corridor is
15 important to the City of Cuyahoga Falls in order to improve safety and reduce congestion; and

17 WHEREAS, this need to improve safety and reduce congestion is vital to improve the quality of life
18 for the citizens and motoring public by reducing emissions, and improving overall safety and well-
19 being of the citizens and visitors of the City of Cuyahoga Falls; and

9 SERVICE TO APPLY FOR FEDERAL SURFACE TRANSPORTATION
10 BLOCK GRANT (STBG) FUNDS PROGRAMMED BY THE AKRON
11 METROPOLITAN AREA TRANSPORTATION STUDY (AMATS), FOR
12 THE RESURFACING OF CHESTNUT BOULEVARD BETWEEN STATE
13 ROAD AND 2ND STREET, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

15 WHEREAS, the City Engineer has identified the need for and proposes the resurfacing of
16 Chestnut Boulevard between State Road and 2nd Street; and

18 WHEREAS, the Akron Metropolitan Area Transportation Study (AMATS) is conducting a
19 competitive grant process under which Federal Surface Transportation Funds may be made
20 available to partially support construction costs for City sponsored projects.

22 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County of
23 Summit and State of Ohio, that:

25 Section 1. The Director of Public Service is authorized to apply for and accept Federal Surface
26 Transportation Block Grant (STBG) Funds programmed by the Akron Metropolitan Area
27 Transportation Study (AMATS), for the purpose of supporting construction costs related to the
28 Project, as follows:

30 Project Name: Chestnut Boulevard Resurfacing

32 Description: From State Road to 2nd Street approximately 5,800-feet. Resurface roadway
33 including grind and pave three-inches (3”) of asphalt pavement, restripe pavement markings
34 and replace traffic loops.

36 Estimated Construction Cost: \$490,000.
37

38 Section 2. This Council’s authorization is granted with the following understandings:

- 40 A. The City will bear one hundred percent (100%) of the cost of preliminary
41 engineering.
- 42 B. The City will bear one hundred percent (100%) of the total cost of those features
43 requested by the City which are not eligible for Federal participation.
