16 WHEREAS, City owned Brookledge Golf Club seeks to replenish its golf cart
17 fleet with eco-friendly, zero-emission golf carts; and
18

19 WHEREAS, a reduction of electricity use and conservation will occur with the
20 new golf cart fleet resulting in a cost savings to the City; and
21

22 WHEREAS, the City and PNC Equipment Finance, LLC and Lake Erie Golf Cars,
23 LLC desire to enter into a new contract for the lease and maintenance of golf carts
24 which is more cost effective and efficient; and
25

26 WHEREAS, Section 2 of the City Charter, adopted pursuant to Art. XVIII,
27 Sections 3 and 7 of the Ohio Constitution, authorizes this Council to make exception
28 to the competitive bidding procedures set forth in the Revised Code.
29

30 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga
31 Falls, County of Summit and State of Ohio, that:

33 Section 1. The Parks and Recreation Board is hereby authorized to enter into a
34 contract or contracts, without competitive bidding, with PNC Equipment Finance,
35 LLC and Lake Erie Golf Cars, LLC for lease and maintenance of 76 golf carts for a
36 period not to exceed six (6) years.

38 Section 2. The Director of Finance is hereby authorized and directed to make
39 payment for same from the Leisure Time Fund, line item Other Operations.

41 Section 3. Any other ordinances and resolutions or portions of ordinances and
42 resolutions inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed, but any ordinances and
43 resolutions or portions of ordinances and resolutions not inconsistent herewith and

28 Section 1. Section 129.01 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Cuyahoga Falls
29 is hereby amended to read in full as follows (new text underlined; deleted text in

33 (a) Subject to the sufficiency of annual or supplemental appropriations for personal
34 services, the Police Department shall be composed of the following sworn officers and
35 other personnel:

- 48 1 Juvenile Diversion Caseworker

49 Regular Part-Time Community Service Officers and Regular Part-Time Laborers
50 as needed and subject to annual or supplemental appropriations.

52 (b) When sufficient appropriations are available and a valid civil service eligible list
53 exists, vacancies in classifications in the Police Department shall be filled from a
54 certified list of candidates within thirty (30) days. If there is no eligible list for a vacant
55 position, the Director of Public Safety shall forthwith request that the Civil Service

56 Commission conduct the needed examinations for the purpose of producing an eligible
57 list. An appointment to fill the vacancy shall be made within thirty (30) days after the
58 Commission certifies a list of candidates from a new eligible list. Nothing in this
59 subsection shall be construed to apply to appointments to the unclassified service or to
60 limit the Commission's authority to waive competitive examinations in accordance with
61 its rules.

63 Section 2. Existing Section 129.01 of the Codified Ordinances, as re-enacted by
64 Ord. No. 17-2015, passed February 23, 2015, is hereby repealed.

66 Section 3. Any other ordinances and resolutions or portions of ordinances and
67 resolutions inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed but any ordinances and
68 resolutions or portions of ordinances and resolutions not inconsistent herewith and
69 which have not previously been repealed are hereby ratified and confirmed.

71 Section 4. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council
72 concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open
73 meeting of this Council and all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees
74 that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance
75 with all legal requirements including Chapter 107 of the Codified Ordinances.

77 Section 5. This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary
78 for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety, convenience and welfare of the
79 City of Cuyahoga Falls and the inhabitants thereof and provided it receives the
80 affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members elected or appointed to Council, it shall
81 take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor;
82 otherwise it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest period allowed by law.
