9 INTO AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT WITH THE
10 COUNTY OF SUMMIT AND CITIES OF AKRON, FAIRLAWN,
11 GREEN AND STOW (“PARTIES”) FOR THE ACQUISITION,
12 INSTALLATION AND OPERATION OF A CONSOLIDATED
13 COMPUTER AIDED DISPATCH SYSTEM, AND DECLARING
14 AN EMERGENCY.

16
17 WHEREAS, each of the Parties operate a Public Safety Answering Point (“PSAP”)
18 through which they dispatch emergency calls to public safety forces, both within their
19 individual communities and for other political subdivisions for which they have contracts to
20 provide dispatch services; and

21
22 WHEREAS, the City of Cuyahoga Falls (“Cuyahoga Falls”) and the Parties desire to
23 procure a consolidated Computer Aided Dispatch System (“Consolidated CAD System”) for
24 their collective use in each of their PSAP operations and the dispatch operations of their
25 public safety forces and the safety forces of the Contracted Dispatch Communities (“PSAP
26 and Dispatch Operations”); and

27
28 WHEREAS, Cuyahoga Falls and the Parties desire to procure a Consolidated CAD
29 System for their collective use in order to maintain full interoperability and redundancy,
30 replace aging systems, reduce their costs from replacing multiple systems, and improve the
31 safety of their residents; and

32
33 WHEREAS, Cuyahoga Falls and the Parties and their consultant have identified
34 Tyler Technologies’ (“Tyler”) New World Computer Aided Dispatch Platform (“Tyler CAD
35 System”) as the most comprehensive system for their use as a Consolidated CAD System,
36 and the same can be procured by the County through their procurement processes; and

37
38 WHEREAS, Cuyahoga Falls and the Parties intend for the County to purchase the
39 Tyler CAD System to serve as the Consolidated CAD System for their PSAP and Dispatch
40 Operations, and the Parties intend to share in the cost of the purchase of the Tyler CAD
41 System, as set forth in the Intergovernmental Agreement (“Agreement”); and

42
43 WHEREAS, Cuyahoga Falls and the Parties further intend for the Consolidated CAD
44 system to be owned by the County and to be shared by the Parties for their individual and
45 collective use in their PSAP and Dispatch Operations, as set forth in the Agreement; and

46
47 WHEREAS, Cuyahoga Falls and the Parties have set forth in the Agreement the
48 terms whereby the Consolidated CAD System shall be used, operated and maintained and
49 whereby the Parties shall share in the costs for the ongoing use, operation and
50 maintenance; and

51
52 WHEREAS, through collaboration, the Parties are able to provide their communities
53 with an efficient, updated Consolidated CAD System at a cost savings to the residents.

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55 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls,
56 County of Summit, and State of Ohio, that:

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Section 1. The Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into an Intergovernmental Agreement with the County of Summit and Cities of Akron, Fairlawn, Green and Stow for the acquisition, installation and operation of a consolidated Computer Aided Dispatch system pursuant to the terms set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated into this ordinance, together with such revisions, additions or amendments as are approved by the Director of Law as being consistent with the objectives and requirements of this ordinance; and the Mayor, Director of Law, Director of Finance and other necessary City officials are authorized to provide such other information and to execute such other documents and amendments to the Intergovernmental Agreement and do all other actions as are necessary for and incidental to carrying out the requirements of this ordinance and the terms of the Intergovernmental Agreement.

Section 2. The Director of Finance is hereby authorized to increase appropriations in the Capital Projects Fund, line item Capital Outlay in the amount of \$199,734 and to make payment from the same.

Section 3. Any ordinances or resolutions or portions of ordinances and resolutions inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed, but any ordinances and resolutions not inconsistent herewith and which have not previously been repealed are hereby ratified and confirmed.

Section 4. 

16 WHEREAS, Falls River Phase II, LLC has made a significant investment in the development of South Front
17 Street thereby adding economic growth and opportunities to the community; and

18
19 WHEREAS, Falls River Phase II, LLC desires to expand economic development in the South Front Street
20 area and needs financial assistance to secure additional parking to ensure the success of its new business
21 ventures; and

22
23 WHEREAS, the Cuyahoga River Corridor Brownfield Master Plan encourages the City to provide
24 parking in strategic locations; and

25
26 WHEREAS, on-street parking is limited throughout South Front Street and in most cases,
27 driveway entrances dominate limiting the potential for parking; and

28
29 WHEREAS, parking is essential to the economic growth of downtown as potential customers are
30 more likely to avoid visiting businesses without convenient parking; and

31
32 WHEREAS, the City desires to encourage continued housing and economic opportunities on
33 South Front Street; and

34
35 WHEREAS, funding acquisition of land for parking on South Front Street was identified and approved by
36 the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development in the City's 2017 Action Plan; and

38 WHEREAS, an Agreement between the City and Falls River Phase II, LLC provides a cost effective way to
39 obtain these additional parking spaces.

41 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County of Summit

47 exceed \$300,000 for the purpose of providing public parking.



EXHIBIT ALegal Description

Situated in the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County of Summit and State of Ohio and known as being a part of Lots 13 and 14, Block 17 as shown on the plat of the City of Cuyahoga Falls in Transcribed Records, Page 15 of the Summit County record of plats and is further bounded and described as follows, to wit:

Beginning at a 1 1/2" solid steel pin found at an angle point in the east line of Second Street and in the east line of said Block 17; said beginning point is North 25°-00'-00" East a distance of 232.95 feet from the point of intersection of the east line of Second Street with the north line of Sackett Avenue (37.50' R/W);

Thence, from said beginning point South 25°-00'-00" West along the east line of Second Street and the east line of Block 17 a distance of 88.33 feet to a 5/8" rebar and the true place of beginning of the parcel of land hereinafter described;

Thence, South 75°-42'-04" East along the south line of property presently owned by R. L. Stewart (Vol. 5575, page 34) a distance of 145.85 feet to a point in the west wall of a concrete block building;

Thence, North 17°-40'-34" East along the exterior face of said building wall and the east line of said Stewart land a distance of 4.99 feet to the northwest corner of said building.

Thence, South 25°-07'-52" West along the west line of Front Street and the west line of Block 17 a distance of 208.91 feet to a drill hole in the back edge of the sidewalk at the point of intersection of the west line of Front Street with the north line of Sackett Avenue;

Thence, North 64°-43'-30" West along the north line of Sackett Avenue a distance of 148.13 feet to a 5/8" rebar set at the southeast corner of land presently owned by Grace Morris (Vol. 2885, Page 281);

Thence, North 25°-30'-57" East along the east line of said Morris land a distance of 122.00 feet to the northeast corner of said Morris land;

Thence, North 72°-05'-03" West along the north line of said Morris land a distance of 52.70 feet to the northwest corner of said Morris land;



Thence, South 25°-00'-00" West along the west line of said Morris land a distance of 3.25 feet to the northeast corner of land presently owned by R.C. and M.E. Rumberger;

Thence, North 71°-51'-15" West along the north line of said Rumberger land a distance of 132.95 feet to the northwest corner of said Rumberger land in the east line of Second Street and the east line of Block 17;

9 ORDINANCES, RELATING TO PARKING METERS IN THE CITY
10 OF CUYAHOGA FALLS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

13 WHEREAS, parking meters have recently been installed in the newly revitalized Downtown
14 Cuyahoga Falls area; and

15
16 WHEREAS, existing sections of Chapter 353 involving parking meters are antiquated and
17 need updated to reflect current practices.

18
19 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County
20 of Summit, and State of Ohio, that:

21
22 Section 1. Chapter 353, Parking Meters of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Cuyahoga
23 Falls is hereby amended and/or supplemented to read in full as follows (new text double
24 underlined; deleted text in ~~strikethrough~~):

25
26 CHAPTER 353

27
28 **354.04 REGULATION OF PARKING IN INDIVIDUAL PARKING SPACES.**

29
30 Whenever a vehicle shall be parked in an individual parking space where a parking meter has
31 been installed, the person parking such vehicle shall ~~deposit a coin or combination of coins of~~
32 United States money ~~make payment~~ in such parking meter, if such meter displays the signal
33 showing that legal parking is only permitted on such deposit.

34
35 The Safety Director, in accordance with the provisions of this chapter, shall determine the
36 length of time that parking is permitted in an individual parking space for which a meter is
37 installed, ~~upon the deposit of a coin or combination of coins~~ payment in the parking meter as
38 hereinbefore provided. Notice to the public shall be given by appropriate signs setting forth the
39 length of time for which parking is permitted and conditions thereof. These may be upon the
40 parking meter stand or in the immediate vicinity. Any vehicle which remains in an individual
41 parking space after the prescribed time for parking is hereby determined to be illegally parked,
42 but in no event shall it be considered illegal parking if the meter display signal shows that a
43 proper deposit has been made for such parking.

44
45 The provisions of this chapter shall not apply to vehicles parked or standing upon the streets of
46 the City in parking meter zones when such vehicles are parked or standing upon such streets
47 between the hours of 5:00 p.m. in the evening until 8:00 a.m. the following morning of each week
48 day. The provisions of this chapter shall not apply between 5:00 p.m. Saturday evening and 8:00
49 a.m. the following Monday. The provisions of this chapter shall not apply on Sundays and
50 holidays; but for the purpose of this chapter, the afternoon of Election Day in each November
51 shall not be considered as a holiday or part holiday.

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54 **353.05 EVIDENCE.**

55
56 After the installation of such parking meters, all parking is prohibited in any parking space
57 where a meter is installed which displays a signal showing that parking is not permitted unless a
58 ~~deposit of a coin or combination of coins~~ payment is made as herein provided. Any vehicle parked
59 in violation of this provision shall be deemed to be an illegal parking under the provisions of this
60 chapter. The fact that a vehicle is in an individual parking space when the time signal on the
61 parking meter of the same shows no parking permitted, unless a ~~deposit of a proper coin~~ payment

62 is made as herein provided, shall be deemed prima-facie evidence of the unlawful parking of such
63 motor vehicle by its operator or owner.

65 **353.08 OFFICERS TO REPORT; TICKETS.**

67 (a) It shall be the duty of the police officers of the City, acting in accordance with instructions
68 issued by the Safety Director, to report:

69
70 (1) The number of each parking meter which indicates that the vehicle occupying the
71 parking space adjacent to such parking meter is or has been parked in violation of any of
72 the provisions of this chapter;

73
74 (2) The state license number of such vehicle;

76 (3) The time during which such vehicle is parking in violation of any of the provisions of this
77 chapter;

78
79 (4) Any other facts, a knowledge of which is necessary to a thorough understanding of the
80 circumstances attending such violation.

82 (b) Each such police officer shall also attach to such vehicle a notice to the owner or operator
83 thereof that such vehicle has been parked in violation of a provision of this chapter and
84 instructing such owner or operator where to report ~~at the Violations Bureau of the City~~, in regard
85 to such violation. Such owner or operator may within the time specified on such notice, pay the
86 amount specified ~~to the Violations Bureau~~ as a penalty for such violation. ~~The failure of such~~
87 ~~owner or operator subject to the penalties hereinafter provided for violation of the provisions of~~
88 ~~this chapter. The owner or operator will be subjected to penalties set forth in this chapter if he or~~
89 ~~she fails to pay the required amount.~~

91 Section 2. Any other ordinances and resolutions or portions of ordinances and resolutions
92 inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed but any ordinances and resolutions or portions of
93 ordinances and resolutions not inconsistent herewith and which have not previously been
94 repealed are hereby ratified and confirmed.

96 Section 3. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and
97 relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and all
98 deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in
99 meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Chapter 107 of
100 the Codified Ordinances.

102 Section 4. This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the
103 preservation of the public peace, health, safety, convenience and welfare of the City of Cuyahoga
104 Falls and the inhabitants thereof and provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the
105 members elected or appointed to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its
106 passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest
107 period allowed by law.

10 A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE CITY OF CUYAHOGA FALLS,
11 OHIO TO BE AN IMMIGRANT-FRIENDLY, WELCOMING CITY,
12 SUPPORTING THE CITY'S PARTICIPATION IN THE WELCOMING
13 CITIES AND COUNTIES PROJECT AND WE GLOBAL NETWORK
14 AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE ALL NECESSARY
15 DOCUMENTS TO PARTICIPATE IN SAID PROJECT FOR THE
16 CITY, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.
17

18 WHEREAS, the City of Cuyahoga Falls wishes to enable economic development,
19 facilitate the integration of immigrant populations into the City, retain talent, attract
20 international investment, educate and inform the existing community about their
21 immigrant neighbors, and support the immigrant community in reaching its full potential;
22 and
23

24 WHEREAS, immigrants add civic, cultural, and economic value to communities
25 they adopt as their new homes, and are also prospective entrepreneurs who start
26 businesses, create jobs, complement the skills of the workforce, produce greater demand
27 for existing businesses and services, and help revitalize neighborhoods; and
28

29 WHEREAS, the City recognizes that a welcoming community is more likely to thrive,
30 and wishes to unite with a cohort of cities and counties around the country that have
31 pledged to become more immigrant-friendly by joining the Welcoming Cities and Counties
32 Project and the WE Global Network for the Great Lakes region; and
33

34 WHEREAS the City desire to join other municipalities and the County of Summit in
35 their endeavor by declaring the City of Cuyahoga Falls as Welcoming City; and
36

37 WHEREAS the City has already taken action to integrate the immigrant population
38 through various City-sponsored activities and programs and believes that participation in the
39 Welcoming Cities and Counties Project and WE Global Network will further enhance the City's
40 efforts as a Welcoming Community; and
41

42 WHEREAS under the Fair Housing Act of 1968 the City has an obligation to
43 affirmatively further fair housing and has taken meaningful actions to overcome national
44 patterns of segregation, promote fair housing choice, and foster inclusive communities that
45 are free from discrimination; and

47 WHEREAS, affirmatively furthering fair housing means taking meaningful actions
48 relating to housing and urban development, that, taken together, address disparities in
49 housing needs;
50

51 WHEREAS, this Council finds and determines, after reviewing all pertinent
52 information, that it is necessary and in the best interest of the City to declare Cuyahoga
53 Falls to be an immigrant-friendly, welcoming City, support the City's participation in the

54 Welcoming Cities and Counties Project and WE Global Network and authorize the Mayor
55 to execute all necessary documents to participate in said project.

57 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls,
58 County of Summit, and State of Ohio, that:

59 Section 1. Council hereby declares the City of Cuyahoga Falls to be an immigrant-
60 friendly, welcoming City, and announces its support of the City's participation in the
61 Welcoming Cities and Counties Project and WE Global Network.

62
63 Section 2. The Mayor is hereby authorized to execute all necessary documents to
64 participate in said project.

65
66 Section 3. Any other ordinances or resolutions or portions of ordinances and resolutions
67 inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed, but any ordinances and resolutions not inconsistent
68 herewith and which have not previously been repealed are hereby ratified and confirmed.

69
70 Section 4. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning
71 and relating to the adoption of this resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council,
72 and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal
73 action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, to the
74 extent applicable, including Chapter 107 of the Codified Ordinances.

75
76 Section 5. This resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for
77 the preservation of the public peace, health, safety, convenience and welfare of the City of
78 Cuyahoga Falls, and for the further purpose of immediately applying for said project before the
79 beginning of the project's Welcoming Week 2018 to be held the week of September 14-23, 2018,
80 and provided it receives the affirmative vote of two thirds of the members elected or appointed to
81 Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the
82 Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest period allowed by law.
