9 AMENDMENT TO THE LICENSE AGREEMENT WITH SPRINTCOM,
10 INC. FOR THE USE OF A PORTION OF CITY PROPERTY FOR THE
11 INSTALLATION OF TELECOMMUNICATIONS EQUIPMENT, AND
12 DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

14 WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinance No. 27-2000, the City and SprintCom, Inc. entered into a
15 License Agreement on February 23, 2000 which permitted SprintCom, Inc. to access and use the
16 City's property known as Indian Mountain Water Tower ("Property") and located at Bailey Road,
17 Cuyahoga Falls, Ohio for the purpose of installing telecommunications equipment; and
18

19 WHEREAS, the Agreement is set to expire on February 22, 2020, and the City and SprintCom,
20 Inc. desire to extend the term of the Agreement.
21

22 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County of
23 Summit and State of Ohio, that:
24

25 Section 1. The Mayor be and hereby is authorized to enter into an Amendment to the License
26 Agreement with SprintCom, Inc., for the installation of telecommunications equipment upon City
27 property, which new term shall commence on February 22, 2020 with an option to automatically
28 renew for four (4) additional renewal terms of five (5) years each.
29

9 ORDINANCES, RELATING TO SPECIAL POLICE, AND DECLARING
10 AN EMERGENCY.

11
12
13 WHEREAS, the City of Cuyahoga Falls requires a Fire Department employee be empowered
14 to effectively and safely investigate possible cases of arson; and

15
16 WHEREAS, the Ohio Revised Code §737.27 allows for such an appointment.

17
18 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County
19 of Summit, and State of Ohio, that:

20
21 Section 1. Section 129.05 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Cuyahoga Falls are hereby
22 amended to read in full as follows (new text double underlined; deleted text in ~~strike through~~):

23
24 129.05 SPECIAL POLICE.

25
26 (a) The Mayor is hereby enabled to augment the Police Department by empowering
27 the Chief of Police with permission to employ not more than fifty special police, such police to
28 have accreditation and jurisdictional duties of existing patrolmen.

29
30 (1) Special Police for the Municipal Court shall serve as Security Officers for
31 the Court and may seek the assistance of other appropriate law enforcement officers. The Special
32 Police of the Court shall have limited police powers of arrest as set forth under Ohio R.C. 2935.04.
33 They will take an oath administered by the Mayor. The Cuyahoga Falls Police Department will
34 carry their commissions and the Chief of Police shall be consulted and have final approval before
35 any Special Police are employed by the Court, which shall otherwise be responsible for the hiring
36 and dismissal of such persons.

37 (2) The Special Police will wear the uniform of the Cuyahoga Falls Police
38 Department or such variation as approved by the Chief of Police with badges denoting their
39 position as "Special Police". Such officers will have completed twenty years of active duty as a
40 peace officer in accordance with Ohio R.C. 109.78 and will abide by the Rules and Regulations
41 of the Cuyahoga Falls Police Department where not inconsistent with the directions of the Court.

42 (3) Any person employed as a Special Police Officer by the Court shall be
43 deemed a "public employee" as defined in Ohio R.C. 145.01. Such Special Police Officers for the
44 Court shall not be considered employees of the Police Department for purposes of any staffing or
45 appropriations ordinances. Such Special Police Officers for the Court shall be employees of the
46 Court and paid by the Court in accordance with any ordinances pertaining thereto.

47
48 (b) The Police Chief may assign members of the Department of Fire as special police,
49 who shall have the power and duty to be present at all fires, investigate the cause thereof,
50 examine witnesses, compel the attendance of witnesses and the production of books and papers,
51 and to do and perform all other acts necessary to the effective discharge of such duties. Such
52 officer may attend police training, administer oaths, make arrests and enter, for the purpose of
53 examination, any building which, in their opinion, is in danger from fire.

54 (1) Special police appointed pursuant to part (b) of this section shall be
55 empowered to carry a firearm and other police equipment which may be used for the purposes

56 of carrying out their duties and self-defense. Special officers shall obtain training in the use of
57 firearms and law enforcement techniques as required by the Chief of Police.
58 (2) These special police shall remain employees of the Fire Department for all other
59 purposes.

60 Section 2. Any ordinances or resolutions or portions of ordinances and resolutions
61 inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed, but any ordinances and resolutions not inconsistent
62 herewith and which have not previously been repealed are hereby ratified and confirmed.
63

64 Section 3. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and
65 relating to the passage of this ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council and that
66 all deliberations of this Council and of any committees that resulted in those formal actions were
67 in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all requirements including Chapter 107 of
68 the Codified Ordinances.

9 CODIFIED ORDINANCES, RELATING TO PARK RULES AND
10 REGULATIONS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

13 WHEREAS, Cuyahoga Falls Parks and Recreation allows the serving of alcohol at three of
14 their facilities including the Cuyahoga Falls Natatorium, Downtown Pavilion and the Quirk
15 Cultural Center; and

16
17 WHEREAS, currently, legislation exists that prohibits alcohol in Cuyahoga Falls parks
18 themselves; and

19
20 WHEREAS, Cuyahoga Falls has a desire to amend its program offerings and continue to
21 spur economic development by occasionally offering alcohol during City sponsored events at High
22 Bridge Glens and Keyser Park Farmstead; and

23
24 WHEREAS, the allowance of alcohol at events at High Bridge Glens and the Keyser Park
25 Farmstead would be limited in nature and would require the prior approval of the Superintendent
26 of Parks and Recreation and be attended by an off duty Cuyahoga Falls Police Officer; and

27
28 WHEREAS, the city realizes that specific City sponsored events held at High Bridge Glens
29 and Keyser Park Farmstead are in alignment with the allowance of serving alcohol for responsible
30 enjoyment by guests; and

31
32 WHEREAS, the Cuyahoga Falls Parks and Recreation Board is in unanimous favor of allowing
33 the limited, Superintendent-approved allowance of serving alcohol at City sponsored Parks and
34 Recreation events.

35
36 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County
37 of Summit, and State of Ohio, that:

38
39 Section 1. Section 565.04(A)(17) of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Cuyahoga Falls is
40 hereby amended to read in full as follows (new text double underlined; deleted text
41 in ~~strikethrough~~):

42
43 (17) No person shall bring into and/or possess in any park any intoxicating liquor or
44 alcoholic beverage. Alcohol may be served at events sponsored by the City of Cuyahoga Falls in
45 High Bridge Glens and Keyser Park Farmstead and only with the written permission of the Park
46 and Recreation Superintendent. No intoxicated person shall be allowed to enter or remain within
47 any of the parks.

48
49 Section 2. Any ordinances or resolutions or portions of ordinances and resolutions
50 inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed, but any ordinances and resolutions not inconsistent
51 herewith and which have not previously been repealed are hereby ratified and confirmed.

52
53 Section 3. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and
54 relating to the passage of this ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council and that
55 all deliberations of this Council and of any committees that resulted in those formal actions were

56 in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all requirements including Chapter 107 of
57 the Codified Ordinances.

26 of which 94% is spent on direct treatment, community education and outreach; and

28 WHEREAS, the need for access to 24-hour crisis services, residential treatment
29 and recovery support for people diagnosed with mental illness and addiction is a
30 critical need to keep our community safe and healthy; and
31

32 WHEREAS, this Administration and City Council desires to express its support
33 for the proposed renewal levy for the County of Summit ADM Board, and urges the
34 citizens of Cuyahoga Falls to vote YES on Issue 14 at the November 5, 2019, General
35 Election.

37 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls,
38 County of Summit and State of Ohio, that:

40 Section 1. The City Council and Administration express their support for the
41 County of Summit ADM Board’s Renewal Levy and urge the passage of Issue 14 at the

18 the recommendations of the Tax Incentive Review Council and the Community
19 Reinvestment Area Housing Council for tax exemption agreements in effect during
20 the 2018 tax year; and

22 WHEREAS, it is necessary to adjust Resolution 3-2019 to include additional
23 recommendations of the Tax Incentive Review Council for tax exemption
24 agreements in effect during the 2018 tax year.

31 tax year with additions for the following two (2) Enterprise Zone Agreements, as
