21 same from the Water Fund, line item Capital Outlay.

7 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 94-2019 AUTHORIZING THE  
8 DIRECTORS OF SAFETY AND PUBLIC SERVICE TO ENTER INTO A  
9 CONTRACT OR CONTRACTS, ACCORDING TO LAW, FOR THE  
10 PURCHASE OR LEASE OF VARIOUS VEHICLES FOR USE BY THE CITY;  
11 DECREASING APPROPRIATIONS IN THE SANITATION FUND, AND  
12 DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.  
13

14 WHEREAS, it is necessary to change Exhibit A by amending the purchase and/or lease of certain  
15 vehicles by the Street and Sanitation Division.  
16

17 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County of  
18 Summit, and State of Ohio, that:  
19

20 Section 1. The Directors of Safety or Public Service, as appropriate, are hereby authorized to enter  
21 into contracts for the purchase and/or lease of the vehicles listed on Exhibit A attached hereto or  
22 comparable vehicles not exceeding the budget amounts. Notwithstanding and as an exception to Section  
23 181.06 of the Codified Ordinances, expenditures made under the contracts authorized by this ordinance  
24 shall not exceed, in the aggregate, \$3,009,500, without further consent of City Council by ordinance or  
25 resolution.  
26

27 Section 2. The Director of Finance is hereby directed to make payment for same out of monies  
28 lawfully appropriated therefor, from the funds as indicated in Exhibit A and to decrease appropriations in  
29 the Sanitation Fund, line item Capital Outlay by \$154,000.  
30

31 Section 3. Any ordinances or resolutions or portions of ordinances and resolutions inconsistent  
32 herewith are hereby repealed, but any ordinances and resolutions not inconsistent herewith and which  
33 have not previously been repealed are hereby ratified and confirmed.  
34

35 Section 4. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating  
36 to the passage of this ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations  
37 of this Council and of any committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the  
38 public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Chapter 107 of the Codified Ordinances.

40 Section 5. This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the  
41 preservation of the public peace, health, safety, convenience and welfare of the City of Cuyahoga Falls and  
42 the inhabitants thereof, and provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members elected  
43 or appointed to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by  
44 the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest period allowed by law.

8 CONTRACT WITH FINLEY FIRE EQUIPMENT CO. INC., TO SELL,  
9 WITHOUT COMPETITIVE BIDDING A FIRE VEHICLE, AND

12 WHEREAS, the Cuyahoga Falls Fire Department has an obsolete fire vehicle that is not needed  
13 for any public purpose; and

14  
15 WHEREAS, Finley Fire Equipment Co. Inc. ("Finley") is interested in acquiring said vehicle for  
16 its operations; and

17  
18 WHEREAS, Finley will credit the City \$17,182.55 to offset the cost of fitting a ladder truck  
19 which the City recently purchased from Finley.

20  
21 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County of  
22 Summit and State of Ohio, that:

24 Section 1. The Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into a contract or contracts with Finley Fire  
25 Equipment Co. Inc. for the sale of a 1998 Emergency One Ladder Truck, without competitive  
26 bidding, the proceeds of which will be used to offset the cost of fitting a ladder truck which the City  
27 recently purchased from Finley.

8 A RESOLUTION EXPRESSING SUPPORT FOR AND  
9 URGING PASSAGE OF ISSUE 11, SUMMIT METRO  
10 PARKS TAX LEVY, AT THE PRIMARY ELECTION TO BE  
11 HELD ON MARCH 17, 2020, AND DECLARING AN  
12 EMERGENCY.  
13

14 WHEREAS, the Summit Metro Parks oversees over 14,000 acres across 16 open  
15 parks, serving 5 million visits each year, increasing the quality of life for residents  
16 across Summit County, while preserving green space and protecting the region’s  
17 unique natural and water resources; and  
18

19 WHEREAS, over the past 14 years, Summit Metro Parks have expanded trails  
20 by 25%, added over 5,000 acres of land, and grown by over 1 million visits per year;  
21 and  
22

23 WHEREAS, increases to the Metro Parks’ acreage, visitation, and programming  
24 logically and necessarily require additional funding to sustain the growth; and  
25

26 WHEREAS, the Metro Parks’ current funding levy, in which new funding was  
27 last passed in 2006, was renewed by voters in 2013 after earning 75% of the vote,  
28 and represents 90% of the Metro Parks’ overall funding; and  
29

30 WHEREAS, current levy funding will expire at the end of 2020; and  
31

32 WHEREAS, the Summit Metro Parks has proposed the renewal of their existing  
33 1.46 mill funding levy, with an addition 0.54 mills, to be placed on the March 17th,  
34 2020 ballot – the passage of which will result in an increase of about \$1.58 per  
35 month per \$100,000 property value; and  
36

37 WHEREAS, maintaining our high-quality park system necessitates a modest  
38 increase in funding, and investing in local parks improves local property values and  
39 quality of life for all residents.  
40

41 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga  
42 Falls, County of Summit and State of Ohio, that:  
43

44 Section 1. The Council and Administration express their support for the Summit  
45 Metro Parks and urge the passage of Issue 11 at the March 17, 2020 primary  
46 election.  
47

48 Section 2. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council  
49 concerning and relating to the adoption of this resolution were adopted in an open  
50 meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its  
51 committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public,
