



The **Buildings and Grounds Maintenance Department** oversees cemetery operations for the city's active cemeteries, Oakwood and Northampton, as well as Harrington and Botzum cemeteries. New software was purchased that allows anyone to look up a deceased loved one's location. An interactive map will pinpoint the grave and can even be used on a smartphone while in the cemetery, guiding the user to the grave.

Buildings & Grounds Maintenance is also responsible for tree lawn trees (evaluating for trimming or removal as well as planting new trees), the Adopt-A-Spot program, the City Arboretum, as well as landscaping and maintaining city-owned grounds.

Community Development staff work with local businesses to expand their operations and with businesses from outside the City to relocate to Cuyahoga Falls by offering relocation site analysis, permitting, zoning certificates, and grant and loan funding. In 2022, the Community Development Dept. was able to secure more than \$21,666,000.00 in completed new investment that resulted in the creation of over 198 new jobs.

Housing Department staff enforces code-specific ordinances to maintain the City's housing stock, thereby keeping housing values consistent and steady throughout the City.

Cuyahoga Falls is fortunate to be an entitlement city. As such our City receives HUD funds each year that are used to rehabilitate older homes, acquire and demolish blighted structures, and provide senior snow plow services.

The City installed three new public art pieces throughout the historic Downtown district in 2022. "River Trade" and "Topo Swale" were created and installed by two nationally recognized artists utilizing a grant through the National Endowment for the Arts, "Peace and Joy", by local artist Don Drumm, was also installed in High Bridge Glens Park.

The **Engineering Department** is responsible for the design and construction of all public improvement projects, including street paving, sewers, and water lines. The department serves as the repository for all allotment plot plans, and underground utility maps and has Summit County tax maps and federal government flood plain maps on file.

The Engineering Department assigns house numbers and issues permits for construction in the street or road right-of-way, such as street excavation, sidewalk and drive approach construction, curb cutting, downspout openings, and sanitary sewer lateral and water service connections.

The Engineering Department is proud to research and apply for grant dollars that help fund innovative infrastructure projects, and they utilize public goods funding to replace missing sidewalks to improve connectivity and accessibility for all people.

The City of **Cuyahoga Falls Water System** serves approximately 55,000 people across Cuyahoga Falls, Munroe Falls, and Silver Lake.

The city's water supply comes from 18 drilled wells located in Water Works Park on the south bank of the Cuyahoga River. The Cuyahoga River contributes flow to the aquifer and the wellfield is recharged utilizing channels and lagoons. From the wellfield, water is aerated to remove objectionable gases. Chlorine is added for disinfection, fluoride is added for the prevention of tooth decay, and caustic soda for corrosion control.

The Cuyahoga Falls sanitary and storm sewers are laid out in separate systems. The storm sewer system conducts storm runoff to the nearest natural watercourse, 152 miles of sanitary sewers ranging in size from 6" to 30" in diameter collect industrial, commercial, and residential waste, which is transported to the Akron Water Pollution Control Facility for treatment.



In 1888, City Council passed a resolution authorizing the Falls Edison Electric Light & Power Co. the right to erect pole lines to supply electric street lighting, which marked the formation of the Cuyahoga Falls Light Department.

Today, the **Cuyahoga Falls Electric System** collaborates its power production with American Municipal Power (AMP) and utilizes hydroelectric, wind, and combustion sources to create enough energy to meet the city's residential and commercial amperage needs.

Additionally, the award-winning electric system and its various partnerships provide scholarships, free home energy audits, free home energy kits, and appliance rebate programs.

The Cuyahoga Falls **Street Department** is responsible for clearing snow, capturing leaves, filling pot-holes, and resurfacing roads. Each fall, the city coordinates the removal of leaves from its many miles of streets and municipal properties, including 26 neighborhood parks.

Once the leaves have fallen, the city sends leaf crews armed with vacuum machines and rakes to condense the debris and keep our streets clean.

CLEAR STREETS FOR CLEAN STREETS WINTER TIPS

- In times of heavy snowfall, remove parked cars from city streets so they can be properly plowed.
- Avoid putting snow from driveways or sidewalks into already cleared streets.
- Keep sidewalks free of snow and ice for children, mail carriers, and neighbors.


