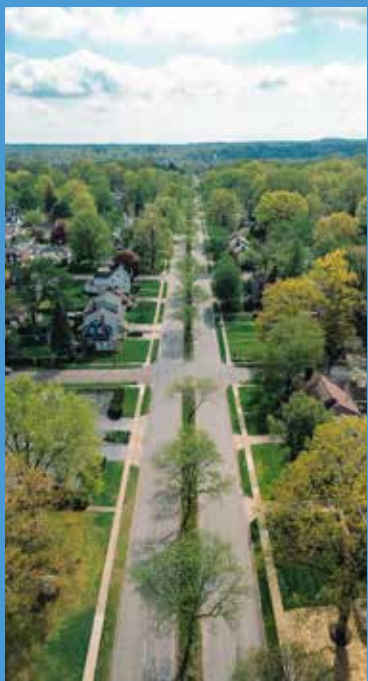
The **Buildings & Grounds Maintenance Department** oversees cemetery operations for the city's active cemeteries, Oakwood and Northampton, as well as Harrington and Botzum cemeteries. Our online records website allows easy access to look up a deceased loved one's location. A photo of the headstone (if there is one) and an interactive map will pinpoint the grave showing exactly where in the cemetery it is located. Community Development (CD) staff work with local businesses to expand their operations and with businesses from outside Cuyahoga Falls to relocate to the City by offering: relocation site analysis, permitting, zoning certificates, and grant/loan funding. In 2024, CD was able to secure more than \$72,000,000 in completed new investments that resulted in the creation of over 264 new jobs.

CD's Housing Dept. staff enforces code-specific ordinances to maintain the City's housing stock, thereby keeping housing values consistent and steady throughout the City.

Cuyahoga Falls is fortunate to be an entitlement city. Each year, the City receives HUD funds and CD's Entitlement Administrator uses those funds to rehabilitate older homes, acquire and demolish blighted structures, and provide seniors with free snow plow services.

In 2024, CD's Planning staff worked with Community stakeholders to develop corridor studies for the Bailey/Northmoreland Road and South State Road Business Corridors. These studies, along with a detailed traffic study conducted in 2025, will provide the City with the necessary tools to seek funding for new streetscape designs in these sections of the City.

The **Engineering Department** is responsible for the design and construction of all public improvement projects, including street paving, sewers, and water lines. The department serves as the repository for all allotment plot plans, and underground utility maps, and has Summit County tax maps and federal government flood plain maps on file.

The Engineering Department assigns house numbers and issues permits for construction in the street or road right-of-way, such as street excavation, sidewalk and drive-approach construction, curb cutting, downspout openings, and sanitary sewer lateral and water-service connections.

The Engineering Department is proud to research and apply for grant dollars to help fund innovative infrastructure projects, and they utilize public goods funding to replace missing sidewalks to improve connectivity and accessibility for all people.

10 Things You Can Do to Prevent Stormwater Runoff Pollution

- Use fertilizers sparingly and sweep up driveways, sidewalks, and roads
- Never dump anything down storm drains
- Vegetate bare spots in your yard
- Compost your yard waste
- Avoid pesticides; learn about Integrated Pest Management (IPM)
- Direct downspouts away from paved surfaces
- Take your car to the car wash instead of washing it in the driveway
- Check car for leaks, and recycle motor oil
- Pick up after your pet
- Inspect and pump your septic tank regularly

The City of Cuyahoga Falls **Water Utilities Department** houses three different divisions: the Water (Distribution and Treatment), Sewer (Sanitary and Storm Collection), and Stormwater Divisions.

The City's water supply comes from 18 wells located on the south bank of the Cuyahoga River. Raw water is pumped from the wellfield to the City's Water Treatment Plant. Minerals are removed, additives are incorporated, water is softened and disinfected, and finally tested in our lab prior to distribution to 55,000 people across Cuyahoga Falls, Munroe Falls, and Silver Lake. The Water Distribution Division maintains over 275 miles of water line, which includes over 2,500 hydrants and over 6,000 valves.

The City's sanitary and storm sewers are laid out in separate systems. The storm sewer system conducts storm runoff to the nearest natural watercourse. The 152 miles of sanitary sewers in the City collect all waste and transport it to either Akron Water Pollution Control Facility or the Summit County Metropolitan Sewer District for treatment. The Sewer Division maintains the City's sewers, manholes, catch basins, and inlets.

The Stormwater Division offers a stormwater inspection to homeowners, which can identify and eliminate stormwater from entering the sanitary sewers. Reducing this inflow and infiltration will help the sanitary sewers work more efficiently during heavy rain events. Residents can help keep stormwater out of the sanitary sewers by verifying that stormwater from their property is directed into the proper sewer.

BUSINESS ENERGY EFFICIENCY REBATE PROGRAM

The City of Cuyahoga Falls is committed to reducing our energy consumption by providing and promoting energy efficiency tools & incentives.

All small, commercial, and industrial customers of the Cuyahoga Falls Electric System are invited to apply for rebates on energy efficiency projects.

Rebate incentive funds are limited and are awarded on a first-come, first-served basis each year. The rebate must be approved and the site inspected BEFORE the project begins. Projects include, but are not limited to, lighting, lighting control, & HVAC upgrades.

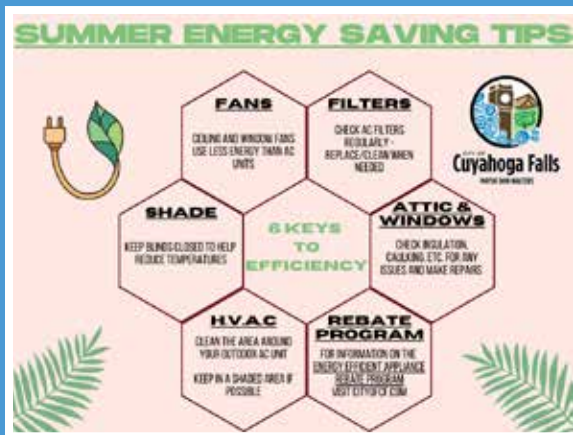


In 1888, City Council passed a resolution authorizing the **Falls Edison Electric Light & Power Co.** the right to erect pole lines to supply electric street lighting, which marked the formation of the Cuyahoga Falls Light Department.

Today, the electric division collaborates its power production with American Municipal Power (AMP) and utilizes hydroelectric, wind, and combustion sources to create enough energy to meet the city's residential and commercial amperage needs.

Additionally, the award-winning electric system and its various partnerships provide scholarships, free home energy audits, free home energy kits, and appliance rebate programs.

The Cuyahoga Falls **Street Department** is responsible for clearing snow, capturing leaves, filling potholes, and resurfacing roads. Each fall, the city coordinates the removal of leaves from its many miles of streets and municipal properties, including 26 neighborhood parks.

Once the leaves have fallen, the city sends leaf crews armed with vacuum machines and rakes to condense the debris and keep our streets clean.

CLEAR STREETS FOR CLEAN STREETS WINTER TIPS

- In times of heavy snowfall, remove parked cars from city streets so they can be properly plowed.
- Avoid putting snow from driveways or sidewalks into already cleared streets.
- Keep sidewalks free of snow and ice for children, mail carriers, and neighbors.

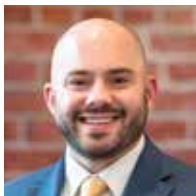
